(1) The failure to report any activity for the Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung (German Soldier's Newspaper) (DSE), the Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung, Edition "B", and the Europaische Welt Korrespondenz (European Defense Newsletter) (EWK) is due to the fact that this office has not as yet received the distribution figures of these publications for the reporting period. However, as these publications have never missed a publishing date, it is safe to assume that they were in fact printed and distributed and that the failure to so report is but a clerical oversight. This will be rectified in next month's report.

(2) The Wehrwissenschaftliche Rundschau (Defense Science Journal) (WWR) was printed and distributed in its usual amount of 5,000 copies. Its articles continued to stress matters of military importance with the theme of these articles being in keeping with U.S. policy. Various writers of both national and international fame contributed to this issue, with the subjects ranging from Captain Liddell Hart's comprehensive past, present, and future evaluation and review of the use of the tank in the military strategies of the world, to an article entitled "Progress of Military Medicine in the Two World Wars."

(3) The information leaflet of the Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde (Society for Defense Science) (GWK) was published four times during the reporting period with each issue being printed in 1,000 copies. The articles and overall theme of the Mitteilungen Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde (Information Sheet of the Society for Defense Science) were devoted primarily to different aspects of the Soviet peace note and its many associated questions. In an attempt to popularize the contractual agreement and the idea of a German contribution to the European Defense Community, the articles continued to stress the military superiority of the West and the unrealistic thinking that produces the belief that Germany will benefit from neutrality.

(4) The individual study groups of the GWK are now preparing 3 new brochures on some of the more controversial points related to the Soviet peace proposal. As these works of the GWK are carefully prepared, they require considerable research and take anywhere from four to eight weeks to produce. The brochures that are now in the mill will be in print by the next reporting period.

(5) The organizational structure of the GWK is expanding at a steadily increasing pace and there are now 55 individual branches of the organization. Even with this rapid expansion, there is no indication of any penetration by Communists or neo-Nazis as rigid requirements for membership must be met before any new member is accepted.

(6) The Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung (German Soldier's Newspaper) (DSZ) printed its first poster this month. It is entitled "Self-Protection Against Soviet Aggression" and was distributed in 18,000 copies throughout West Berlin and West Germany. The poster is a series of three pictures: a policeman shown protecting the public from criminals, a fireman guarding the property of the public from fire, and a line of soldiers from the different Western nations standing against the armed might of the Soviets. The Communists have made a concerted effort to tear down or otherwise mutilate the poster; however, they are immediately replaced in accordance with the contract with the commercial printing firm that printed them.

c. Reaction

(1) In an attempt to counteract the efforts of the Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde, it is reported that a Communist group has established a similar organization. In light of this development, an even closer watch is being kept to avoid penetration of our own group.

(2) Several West German and Western European news-organs have recently made favorable references to the first two brochures of the Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde. This fact, coupled with the demand for these booklets, which necessitated 3,000 additional copies of each being printed, gives an indication of how the material of the GWK is being received. The popularity and reader appeal of the thought provoking material of these brochures prove that, even in the light of the tremendous amount of printed matter circulating throughout Germany today, there is still a demand for a publication which clearly and concisely states a factual and logical argument.
