

NOTE: This project supported propaganda activities of selected West German veterans' groups.

- a. State Secretary Otto Lenz of the Federal Chancellory has promised the Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung (HTFULFIL) a monthly subsidy of DM 10,000. This will enable the paper to continue operations after the PP subsidy has been terminated.
- b. PP support to the Wehr Wissenschaftliche Bundschau (FJSWOUND) was terminated on 24 November 1952. This magazine will be continued with West German government support. Termination was amicable, and the principal agent willingly signed a quit-claim and secrecy agreement.
- c. On 28 and 29 September a special convention of the Geselischaft fuer Wehrkunde (CKSNITCH) was held in Munich. 126 former efficers representing more than 100 local chapters attended this gathering which was primarily devoted to discussions on ratification of the defense agreements. A 64 page brochure in 20,000 copies, "Europe Will do It," dealing with the call for European Unity was released through the Gesellschaft on 1 November 1952. Final details for the termination of the Gesellschaft have not been completed, and it is assumed that some provision will have to be made for the Chief Agent if the West German Government does not decide to continue the support of this organization.
