K. worked for the SD-Leitabschnitt Reichenberg/CSR on a non-salaried basis. He was a member of the "Bund der Deutschen", of the "Deutscher Turnverband" and of the "Kulturverband" in the C.S.R.

From March 1, 1926 to 1933 he was a member of the DNSAP (Deutsche Nationalsozialistische Arbeiterpartei). DNSAP posts: Zellenleiter, Ausbildungsleiter. Member of the following organizations: NSV, DAF, Technische Nothilfe, NS Reichskriegerbund and NS Reichsbund fuer Leibesuebungen.


From 1934 to 1935 K. was active in the "Grenzschutz" from 1935 or 1936 until the summer of 1939, he worked for the "Abwehrstelle" (counter-espionage office) at the General Kommando IV, Dresden.

Military service: Dec 10, 1917 to Jan 19, 1919 in the Austrian Army, rank: Kadett-Aspirant.

1920 or 1921 to 1923 in the Czechoslovakian Army. As of Sept 1, 1940 in the German Army, where he served as a company commander in the 18th Panzer-Division until 1941 and thereafter as an "Abwehroffizier" (officer of the counter-espionage) in Prague.
