Took over NIKHENTROP's former functions in Russian affairs and has been recently responsible for moderation in Baltic policy. Arrested by SD on 1/1/44 at Mordringon Airbase near Stuttgart at the end of December. He was about to board plane for Madrid-Lisbon. His protestations and presentation of travel orders issued by NIKHENTROP were of no avail. Subject's fate is still unknown. The purpose of his mission was supposed to have been broaching negotiations with the Russians. Subject went on a mission for NIKHENTROP to Stockholm 7/19/43 to contact Mrs. KOLLENTAY. This was unsuccessful. Subject's work for NIKHENTROP considered analogous to LANGHEHN's Swiss services for NIKHENTROP.

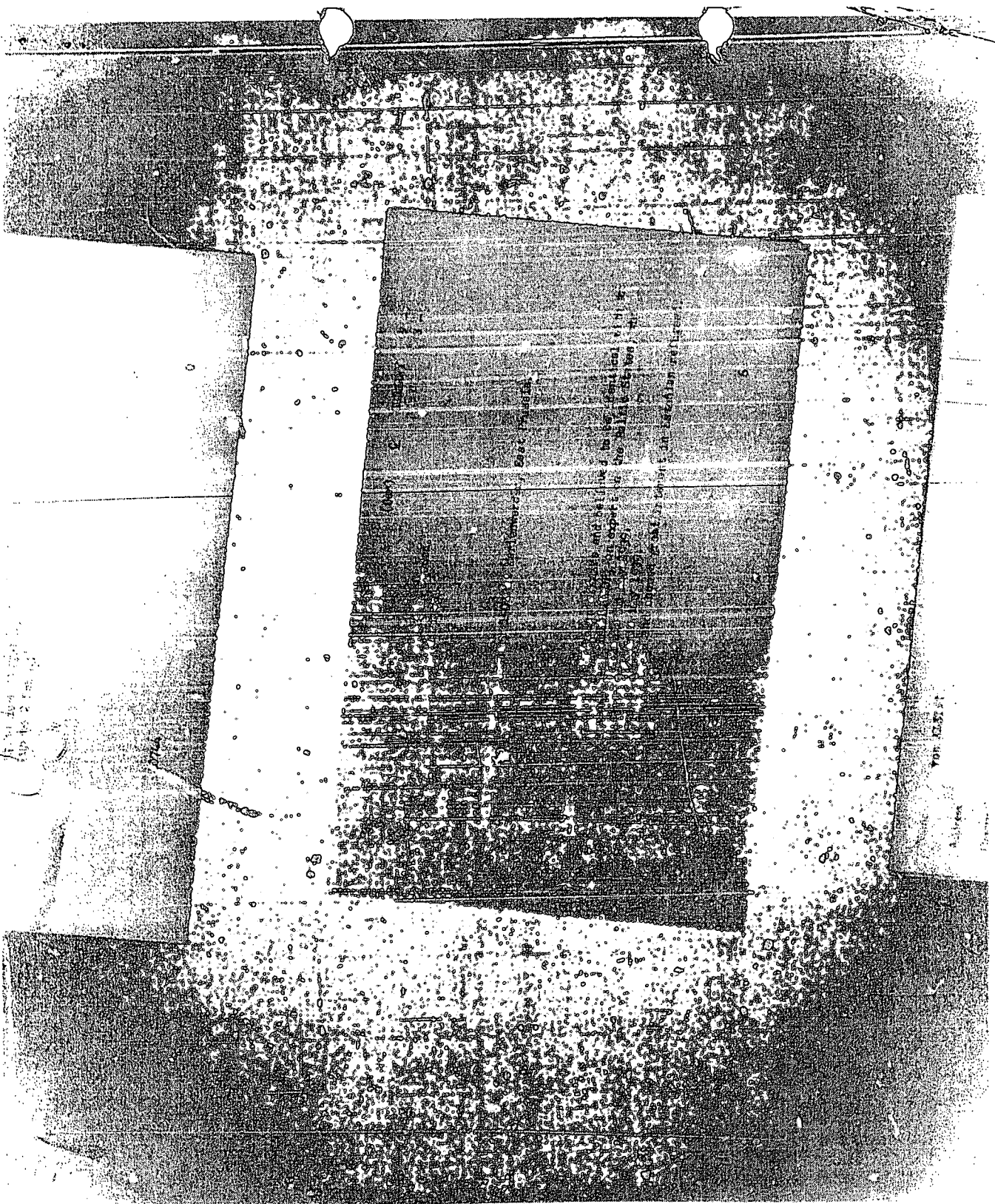
