

<p>1. On 25 September 1970 the undersigned had another meeting with Mr. CORK of LNLUE concerning the anonymous letters received by this office alleging that Dr. Herbert KNORR, Director of the West German Institute for Applied Geodetics (IFAG), is an East German agent. Since the last meeting, Mr. CORK had obtained considerable additional information on IFAG contacts with LNLUTE. Previously, Mr. CORK was of the opinion that the geographic attache at LNCUFF Bonn would only on occasion visit IFAG on routine matters such as acquiring copies of maps and other insignificant items. Also on occasion a LNLEVY representative had paid a courtesy call at IFAG. Mr. CORK and his organization many years ago had severed connections with IFAG.</p> <p>2. In mid-September, Mr. CORK learned from IDENTITY A that he had been to IFAG to discuss cartographic automation. IDENTITY A is Technical Director of IDENTITY B. IDENTITY A had meetings with Dr. KNORR; Dr. HEITZE, head of Geodesy Division, IFAG; Dr. KRETZSCHMAR, head of Photogrammetric Division, IFAG; and a Herr Rolf BOEHME. IDENTITY A also attended the "Symposium of Commission II ISP" which was held in Munich during 15-21 September 1970. There were two PBRUMEN nationals also attending the symposium. They had been sponsored by the East German Government. IDENTITY A learned that these two gentlemen were to visit IFAG after the conference.</p>

<p>3. Mr. CORK also learned that IDENTITY C of IDENTITY B had made an extensive field trip to Germany in March 1970, and during the trip did visit Dr. KNORR of IFAG. IDENTITY A stated IDENTITY C, a naturalized WOCORK citizen, has been employed at IDENTITY B for the past three years. IDENTITY C worked for MHRUSH before going to WOCORK. IDENTITY A told Mr. CORK that IDENTITY C is a problem child and is constantly creating a fuss that he cannot get a higher clearance so that he can have access to all classified material at IDENTITY B. Mr. CORK showed the undersigned a copy of the field report prepared by IDENTITY C regarding his visit with Dr. KNORR. The report is as follows:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">"Professor KNORR appears to be interested in our efforts in the area of automated cartography. A research project named "Ortho Projector" is underway at the IFAG since about 1965 and comprises accuracy investigations of orthophotos, investigations concerning production and utilization of orthophotos and orthophoto plans and research pertaining to the form and production of the orthophoto map. Much of this information has become available."</p> <p>4. About one year ago, IDENTITY D of IDENTITY E visited IFAG. The purpose of the trip was to work up an agreement between LNHARP and MHRUSH on technical matters including automation in cartography.</p> <p>5. All of the LNHARP visitors mentioned above have to clear their visits to IFAG with a Dr. THIESSE of the Ministry of Defense. Dr. THIESSE is the data exchange officer.</p> <p>6. Mr. CORK suggested that JKLANCE contact IDENTITY A to obtain full details of LNHARP relationships with IFAG and to review the entire security precautions. We are very interested in learning the results of Headquarters investigation and to ascertain if there has been any LNLUTE or NATO classified information passed on to Dr. KNORR. We would appreciate a cabled evaluation of the extent to which LNLUTE security or other equities may be involved in this case. as this evaluation will influence the amount of time that [ ] commits to the investigation, including whether or not we try to maintain or turn over to CASEPARATE the communications channel to and from the letter writer.</p> <div style="text-align: center; margin-top: 20px;">[ ]</div> <div style="text-align: center; margin-top: 20px;">  </div>
