1. In response to request in Ref. B, the following additional information concerning the involvement of the student body of the Police Officers School at Berlin/Charlottenburg and Potsdam/Moabit in SICO and SD operations in Poland in September 1939 has been provided by alias CASTER:
- a. The operational group engaged at the outbreak of the war in Poland in September 1939 was the so-called SICO and SD Operational Group with the 14th Army (Einsatzgruppe z.b.V. der Polizei und SD bei der 14. Armee).
- b. This operational group was commanded by the SS-Obergruppenfuehrer Walter Wöhrel (born 24 July 1895 in Salzburg), and was activated on 3 September 1939. It was composed of four battalions of Ordenspolizei under the command of the SICO Colonel, Dr. JOHANNES RÖTER and a 350-man Special SICO Detachment under SS Oberfuehrer, Dr. Otto RASCH (born on 7 December 1891 in Friedrichshafen). The Special SICO Detachment was recruited from the student body of the Police Officer School in Berlin/Charlottenburg, whose commanding officer was SS-Brigadefuehrer Otto HELLER (born on 24 February 1894 in Niedhausen) as well as from the student body of the Potsdam/Moabit Police School, whose commanding officer was one SS-Oberfuehrer THOMAS. HELLER's Deputy at the time was Kommandeur HEINRICH (born on 7 June 1892 in Bamberg on 14 February 1906 in Düsseldorf). W.D. 21

b. CASTROP has requested that the Berlin Document Center make every effort, on the basis of the additional information provided above, to provide answers to the following:

a. When and from what organizations the individuals listed above were transferred into the operational group under von WIRSCH;

b. Where and for how long they were operationally engaged in Poland and into what organizations they were assigned after serving in Poland. (Since, according to CASTROP's information, most members of the von WIRSCH Operational Group are believed to have been attached to Stapoeteile Katowice in September or October 1939, he expressed his particular interest in learning when and to what other Stapo or Kripo organizations any of the individuals listed above may have been detached or transferred after service in Stapoeteile Katowice.)

c. CASTROP states that he can appreciate the amount of work that may be involved on the part of the BDC staff in efforts to track down the information called for. He has indicated, however, that any information that may be forthcoming will be of considerable value to CATIDE in the pursuance of investigations of several important security cases involving persons suspected of having been involved in war crimes committed in Poland as members of the operational group under discussion. CASTROP has stressed again that this matter has been assigned a high priority within CATIDE. Accordingly, an early response will be most appreciated.
