Re: NIKOLAI METLUGIN (alias TENSOGOW, alias PUEANOW
(Suppl. to F. No 6957)

On 16 Feb 1951, Metlugin visited the Harvard group at Lamontstrasse where he had a lengthy conversation with BAUER.

At another time, Prof. FILIPPOV had also seen him there.

During his visit at Lamontstrasse, METLUGIN had a briefcase with him which was stuffed with papers.

Source assumes that METLUGIN is ag in changing his political course from right to left and, after long inspection, investigation and observation, his renewing his former connections with A. KARAKATENKO, A. AMOCHIN and the entire former group of the "SWOBODA" newspaper, in which he himself was active in 1948. (F No 5689).

Visiting the Americans, METLUGIN presents himself as a representative of General WLASSOW in Berlin-Dahlem, and as Chief of the Security Section of RGA, which indeed he had been, although for only a very short time, as a member of the NTS upon the urging of the NTS Group.

The observation continues.

RE: SOCIETY OF RUSSIAN-GERMAN FRIENDSHIP

The idea to create such a society came from the NTS leadership, which assigned the execution to Georg OKOLOWITSCH in Limburg/Lahn and Alexander TRUBCHENOWITSCH in Berlin. The aim of the society is subversive activity among the German population of the East Zone and among the Soviet occupation troops there.

It is also known that I. SOKOLOV is an informant of the "closed sector" of the SBORH and was smuggled into the KOW as an observer. SOKOLOV's former connection with Soviet Major TECHERNOV and with the Soviet Mission demonstrates what kind of elements are active in the "closed sector" of the SBORH.

SOKOLOV is connected with V. MUDROW, W. PUCH and Hans BENDER (Detachementstrasse 2) and also disseminated forged FX cards, made by PUCH.

4A. SIBIGAJEW belongs to the "closed sector" of the SBORH through F. LEUCOSTAJEW.

3) Seman OSLOMENIJ (Supplement to F No. 6911, 6939)

He is connected with the a.m. person and, as a steady visitor of the "WOENKOMAT", he is according to new information a participant in the arms sales which have lately been going on in Woenkomat (Kanalstrasse No 2) and in which Soviet criminal elements are participating. An automatic pistol with 14 cartridges may be bought for 120-130 DM. If 100 automatic pistols are bought, the price decreased down to 90 DM. Automatic pistols for 150-180 DM are also sold. The information comes from the wives of the bandits who are not in on the arms deals and who therefore cannot give complete and exact information on this matter.

For technical reasons, the purchase of arms in this manner is not possible.

Re: THE SLAVIC ELEMENT IN THE LIEKE GROUP

(Suppl to F No 6970)

The shadowing of Dr Mikhail CORZAN, the orthodox priest who is behind Prof. LIEKE, has brought the following information:

CORZAN wears civilian clothing despite his clerical position. He speaks a Moldavian-Ukrainian dialect. He lives with his wife in a room where he also has his office (Berzog Heinrichstrasse, No 38/II). He knows the history of

the orthodox Church in Poland, beginning with the 1920's until today. He claims to have been a member of the consistory of the Orthodox Church in Poland. At present, he claims to be under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop ENSAWA (SOBETOW) in London. Archbishop ENSAWA, who is supported by English official circles, occupies a rather uncertain position: "Archbishop for the Orthodox Poles in the Anders Army".

It was reported in F No 4044 that Bishop ENSAWA-SOBETOW had dealings with the Soviet agent KIMATSCHEK (GERMOGEE) and had contact with the Moscow Patriarch. There is no information concerning the termination of these contacts.

According to CORZAN, ENSAWA-SOBETOW is a follower of the "Liga Universalis Christiana" and of the "Stockholm Appeal." CORZAN moreover said that he belongs to a Church organization which does not concern itself with the recruiting of members; that is done by the "Liga" which preaches simultaneously the rapprochement of the churches and the fight against war. During the conversation, CORZAN tried to emphasize his personal acquaintanceship with anti-Soviet orthodox priests.

At the end, CORZAN again asked the source about those who had sent him into the "Liga". He was satisfied with the answer and promised to give instructions for the work as well as material aid for railroad trips, and asked the source immediately to find a room for a Polish friend who had just arrived in Munich. He did not say from where this friend had come. The reporter has found out that CORZAN's wife is corresponding with Poland.

Already in 1948, the priest Alexander KISSILEW, former Priest at Neuer-Kirchenstrasse No 5, who has emigrated to the U.S., and the Priest Georg BEKIOSON, former Russian clergymen in Hamburg, had contact with the LUDKE organization.

This contact had been established by Valerij MICHELSON, the former chairman of the student union of the UREGA University, who had also emigrated to the USA.

Regarding Valerij MICHELSON, the following was reported in F No 4869, (20 May 49):

- 1) Former lieutenant of NKVD troops;
- 2) Close to IMCA circles, through which he is connected with the Priest KISHKIN;
- 3) Contact with the KOT-ATKIN circles and AMERBACH.
- 4) Contact with K. BLUMBERG, a shady personality (F No 2757, 2798, 4310).
- 5) French Intelligence has shown interest in W. MICHELSON.

As known, N. FARKHUS was active in the movement of Church Unification and thus, according to source, had frequent contact with LIEBE.

Re: ARMY-AMERICANISM

David J. The entire article is not only directed against American policy in general and Germany in particular, but primarily against American Intelligence in which the word "Intelligence" is set off in quotation marks with contemplated disrespect.

In an epigraph to his article which appears before the text, DALIN writes literally: "The officers of the Intelligence of the USA who, during the war, looked with favor upon the Communists, now prefer the supporters of the Guards and the reactionaries, without paying any attention to the great number of pro-Democratic Russians."
