CON files contain the following traces:

1. Kurt BAUER: (see Dr. Jan) Kurt BAUER, born 26 Feb 22 in MANNHEIM, joined Party and NS in May 33, made SS BRIG and GROSS (Nazi Org), 1940, of ORPO, WEIMARER KRIEG. He was interrogated by CIC in June 45. SAIG/DIR/161, 12 Jul 45.

2. Miss BRUNNENBERG: No trace.

3. Theo Otto FEUCHNER:

(a) Theo Otto FEUCHNER, journalist, Munich, Franziskanerstr 41, was representative of the Deutschen Korrespondenz, published by the Bundespressstelle. FEUCHNER is listed as one of the Germans participating in the founding of the "Deutsch-Russische Antikommunistische Gesellschaft", or the "Deutsch-Russischer Demokratischer Bund", headed by Prince MICHAEL-DONALDUS Munich/Solln, Franziskanerstr. 41. The organization was close to the Deutschen Union and HAUSLEITER and rejected other groups as "leftish Socialists". MOBA-2007, 1 Sep 51.

(b) Theo Otto FEUCHNER, born 3 Dec 13, residing Munich, Franziskanerstr 41, was placed on the BfV Warning List on Aug 52 as financially uncorruptible, suspected of having worked for other intelligence organizations, and as being known as an unreliable informant. MOBA-1201, 24 Sep 52.

(c) Otto FEUCHNER, Munich journalist, and BfV informant, was well acquainted with Erich Walter RUPNOW, whose intelligence connections include the FIS, Cashbook, AFI, LfV Heese and LfV Devaris as well as assorted DDR personalities. FEUCHNER compiled an extensive dossier on the important local and foreign contacts of F. W. HEINZ and gave the dossier to GALLER of the BfV in KOBLIN. GALLER reported this to Dr. ADENAUER who immediately conferred with BLANK and Staatssekretar LENZ, resulting in FEUCHNER's recall to KOBLIN where GALLER returned his material on HEINZ and warned him strongly to be completely quiet about it and to offer it to no one. RUPNOW's suggestion that FEUCHNER give the material to another Intelligence Service was refused by FEUCHNER (R-3). MOBA-6970, 10 Jul 52.

(d) FEUCHNER, Otto Theodore (Toddy); born 3 Dec 13 in Mannheim; lives Franziskaner str. 41, Munich; former emigrant in England where he worked with the Prisoner Information Division; after 1949 worked for a time for the Neue Zeitung.

and later for the BRUNING RUE This is reported to have participated in the establishment of the Deutsch-ukrainische antikomunistische Gesellschaft (German-Ukrainian Anti-Communist Society); at the same time is reported to have had some connections with Communist circles. LCIA-4011, 16 Jan 53.

4. (fms) CHOVATSKI (nearest trace, Maria KLODZKI, born 30 May 95, a Ukrainian who last known address was Hersfeld, Kriegerschule DF camp, was an agent dropped without prejudice on 13 Jun 49. ANNEX B, Dropped Agents List, 1 Sep 49.

5. Petro CHURCHIK no trace.

6. Igor GORDEYEVICH aka CHURCHIK

(a) Attached for WED is a copy of subject's ZK LOPE file.

(b) CHURCHIK, I.: member of press section of German-Ukrainian Society. DM-6042, 13 Dec 54 (IKK received a copy.)

7. (fms) KOSAK (presumably Volodimir KOSAK):

(a) KOSAK, Volodymyr, born 20 Mar 10, welding Munich, Meissnerstr. 5, was a delegate to the Congress of Ukrainian RUZHON Nationalists in London on Jun 53. He comes from Germany. OLA-220, 21 May 53.

(b) KOSAK, Volodimir is a close associate of Michael WOLZ who, according to CON files is an employee of ZIPPER. Traces in CIE files show KOSAK as a member of the SB in Munich. IV-2006 2-109330; 14 Aug 52; Subject WOLZ, Michael.

(c) KOSAK, fms [ ] reported to the IIS that the BOGATYCHUK and KOSACH factions of the OUFD had definitely split, KOSACH attacking the UVA and demanding recognition as chief of the OUFD. IRN-414, 12 Jun 53.

(d) (Captain) Volodymyr KOSAK was a former officer of the "Galicia" division. AECAPELIN conferred with KOSAK during AECAPELIN's investigation of the anti-communist Atanas FIOCK, also a former member of the "Galicia" division. FIOCK, active with the Ukrainian Central Committee, had been accused of the misuse of "Galicia" division funds for widows and orphans. KOSAK told AECAPELIN the accusations were untrue. BRM-9613; 27 Jan 54.

(e) Vladimir KOSAK, according to [ ] was elected to the Directorate of the Ukrainian Refugee Congress, 14-16 Aug 53, which was controlled by a fused group of the BAIKOVA-BILYAN bloc of "westerners" vs. "easterners" who received only minor posts. BRM-10292; 17 Mar 54.

(f) Volodimir KOSAK: See CAMLEN Reports: MEM-7218, MEM-7367, MEM-8949, MEM-10267, dated 30 Jun 52, and BRM-12536, dated 26 Sep 54.

8. Karl WALZ: NO trace.

9. Ivan LESKOVICH was a member of the Floren (Bida TAPUEN) of the Ukrainian Congress of Refugees, 14-16 Aug 53. (See par 7 above). [ ] info on this

Congress was from Deputy Ataman of the Ukrainian Free Councils General Yegor GOBANYUK and members of the Directorate of the UVR (Ukrainian Liberation Movement) Vladimir ZOLOZARENKO.

10. Dmitri PERKOV: No further traces

11. (Dr.) Ivan <sup>John</sup> RYBIZ (RYBIZ): No further traces

12. (Dr.) (Mrs) MIROVICH: No trace

13. Andrei Yur'evich MIKULIN:

a. Andrei MIKULIN, residing in Buenos Aires, <sup>Argentina</sup> came from Argentina as a delegate to the Congress of Ukrainian Nationalists in London on 20 Jun 53. OELA 2205, 21 Mar 53.

b. Andrej MIKULAS, residing Exaba 7, Korymovaani u. no. 4, is named by Source (Czech Refugee C/256) as the Slovakian commercial engineer husband of Eva MIKULASOVA on whom there is a HEDOP special report. EGBA 7458, 2 Sept 53.

c. (Captain) Andrei MIKULIN is listed by CAPELIN as one of his sources for his 28 Jun 53 report on the suspicious activities of (Bishop) Gleksly PHILIPENKO of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church. PHILIPENKO was suspected as a Soviet agent penetrating the Church. MIKULIN was described by CAPELIN as a ZHOUN leader in Argentina recently visiting in Germany. EGMA 7763, 23 Sept 53.

d. Andrei MIKULIN: If MOB does not have CAPELIN Report EGMA 6444, 30 Jun 53, subject: Andrei MIKULIN, COM will send a copy on request.

14. Petro PASENIK:

a. PASENIK, possibly identical with PASENIK, from ZHOUN member, EGMA 12566, 26 Sept 54, CAPELIN Report

b. PASENIK, (Mrs) born ca 1879, was BANDERA man in Munich. EGMA-11584, 24 Jun 54, quoted in trace request.

15. Friedrich ROEDER:

a. Friedrich ROEDER, reports that ROEDER is Secretary General and legal advisor of the Export Club in Munich. The Export Club, backed by wealthy German industrialists, conducts discussions on current political problems and on economic trading possibilities. The Club is closely connected with Europa Union, of which ROEDER is one of the leaders. first met ROEDER through SEMIONOV and CAROLATH in 52 and has continued the contact as it was job in B-2 to cover Rightist political affairs in that district.

He felt ROEDER, a Rightist by inclination, and a former member of the Rosenberg Ministry, might be useful. [ ] Reports, however, that ROEDER is rather wordy, but gives out little important information, and that ROEDER is rather wordy, but gives little important information, and that ROEDER is valuable only because he has good contacts which he probably built up during the Rosenberg days...Soviet emigration contacts which ROEDER still maintains. [ ] knew no names of such contacts but felt he could secure them if necessary. Because of the Rosenberg stamp on ROEDER, [ ] is extremely skeptical of him. ROEDER can be reached through the Export Club, Karlsplatz 11/12, Munich, Att. B, p. 18, EOWA 8322, 21 Oct 53.

b. Dr. Friedrich ROEDER is an active, unpaid informer of [ ] with no known Zipper connections. ROEDER's affiliation with some German agency is possible. He provides [ ] with miscellaneous local German information. EOWA 13171, 10 Nov 54.

c. Dr. Friedrich ROEDER, executive director of the Export Club is listed as one of the Germans participating in the founding of the "Deutsche-Russische Antikommunistische Gesellschaft" (See para 3 a above) EOWA 8067, 1 Sept 51.

d. If MOB does not have copy of the following, please request: Report, EOWA 9800, 18 Feb 54, Att A: "Conference with Friedrich ROEDER on Questions of Eastern Politics"

16. Yuri BANKIV: No trace

17. Ivan SHANESKI:

a. Ivan SHANESKI, according to [ ] was elected as Chairman of the Controlling Commission of the Ukrainian Refugee Congress, 14-16 Aug 53, which was controlled by a fused group of the BANDEWA-BERTMAN bloc of "Westerners" vs the "Easterners" who received only minor posts. EOWA 10292, 17 Mar 54.

b. Peter Ivan SHANESKI-BORK is a former associate of White Russian General BISKUPSKI in Berlin. BISKUPSKI in 1924-25 in Munich organized the MLADOROSSOV Party, a monarchist legitimist party which aimed to gather Russian emigrant youth around the newly "crowned Tsar", Grand Duke Cyril. This party fell in 32 under BISKUPSKI's assistant (Col) FRAZHEVICH then in Berlin, who used the organization as an intelligence collecting agency for the Soviets, especially in the Balkans. The party collected info on activities of White Russian anti-Sov groups and penetrated the NISNP as well as the NOV8. (B-3) Munich, AB-102, Subj: MLADOROSSOV MONARCHIST PARTY, Report No. 232, 16 July 1946.

18. Volodimir SLIMAKOVSKI:

(a) (Engineer) Slav SLIMAKOVSKI is mentioned by Marianna Elisabeth KORZHAN: "From my first day in Munich, from my first meeting with Olga VILIPOVICH and her husband, from my first encounter with Engineer SLIMAKOVSKI... I felt everyone suspected me of having been sent to Munich by the Bolsheviks." EGMA-12163; 17 Aug 54 (Subjects: Appearance of Michael KORZHAN's wife in Munich).

(b) SLIMAKOVSKI, Volodimir, lives at a government camp in Munich-Moosach, Seckhamerstr 4. ABEPELIN: EGMA-11836; 16 Jul 54.

(c) Volodymyr SLIMAKOVSKI is carded to MOWA-8530, date unknown, and MOWA-10577, 22 July 52. Neither of these dispatches can be located in COM files; it is requested that SS send us copies if possible. MCB may have MOWA-8530 which appears to have been an ABEPELIN report.

19. Yuri STUDINSKI:

(a) Yuri STUDINSKI was a member of the Plerum (Rada ToPUKH) of the Ukrainian Congress of Refugees, 14-16 Aug 53, (see Para 7 e above) EGMA-10292; 17 Mar 54.

(b) STUDINSKI, cited as son of the late well known Ukrainian scholar. ABEPELIN, EGMA-4699, 30 Mar 53.

(c) Yuri STUDINSKI, (professor) at the Free Ukrainian University and guest lecturer in economics and social problems, is listed as among the prospective teaching personnel of a proposed Ukrainian Cadre School. The school, to be controlled covertly by CASSOWARY 1 as a recruitment and training program for agents in current operations in the Ukrainian SSR, was planned to offer, overtly, all-emigre refresher courses in patriotic anti-communism. Its proposed site was near Weilheim, Bavaria, ca 40 km southwest of Munich. EGMA 2359; 11 Dec 52.

(d) Georg von STUDINSKI, born 1903 in Lvov, residing 13b Starnberg, Wittelsbachstr 14/II, professor at the Ukrainian Free University in Munich, was subject of trace request. SPROB 3133; 26 Oct 54.

(e) Prof. Yuri STUDINSKI reported via CAPELIN on the creation of a new Ukrainian Party. (Report includes info on STUDINSKI.) If MCB has no copy of this report, please request same. Att. 8 to EGMA 4699; 30 Mar 53; CAPELIN REPORT.

(f) Yuri STUDINSKI, aka Yuri STUDINSKIY was one of the outstanding Ukrainian emigre journalists. He contributed to Buchazna Ukraina (Ukraine Today), the official organ of YPUHWR (Foreign Representation of the Ukrainian Chief Liberation Council). HICOG Biographical Roster of Russian and National Minority Emigre Personalities, 2017, p. 66; 17 Mar 53.

20. Gregor USCHIKALO:

(a) Grigoriy Petrovitch USCHIKALO, born 15 Mar 20, is listed as Identity 137 on the AKPAM membership list. No indication he is presently active. Check SCOPEB. EGMA-7006; 29 Jul 53.

(b) (Col.) USUKALOV: One Aleksei Pavlovich KUPCHENIN, alias Roman Pavlovich ZAKHARCHY, a later defector, served in a motor company as an army private serving the Central Group of Forces in Baden as a passenger car driver in the second platoon, from Mar 51 until his desertion in Sep 51, during which time he was driver for (Col.) KRASAVIN, Deputy Chief of Signal Troop and for Col. USUKALOV, Chief of Personnel (Cadre) Troop, MOW-7642; 29 Nov 51.

(c) Sra USUKALOV: Card states was political leader of a Beyon Ootel (No. 4. HEB; Det #6401) Ref: USSR: C13-D; 25 Dec 42. Document not available.

21. Rostislav YENIN

(a) (Dr.) Rostislav YENIN, Boris LAVITSKY and (Prof.) Vasil Antonovich MULLER and the entire ZP/UHVR complex are listed as the present friends of Ivan WAISERLAKO, leader of the URDP-Left and a contributor (journalist is under pseudonym Ivan KORSUN) to Suchasna Ukraina, the ZP/UHVR organ published in Munich. CAPELIN REPORT: EOMA 5008, 15 Apr 53.

(b) A copy of EOMA 9640; 29 Jan 54 is attached hereto for HEB.

22. Olesky ZAPOROZHETS

(a) ZAPOROZHETS, (Cra) is cited as president of the Vieski Beyon Executive Committee, headquartered in Ul Stalina No. 2-4, formerly Ulisa Lyozokowska, which is listed as the fifth Beyon Party Committee under the Lvov Hndroyon Party Committee. (MIS) MSC/RUR/424; 13 Jan 47; Subject: Work Method of the Soviet Party Apparatus in West Ukraine.

(b) ZAPOROZHETS, Sra, is carded as an engineer, residing Maserburgstr 29, Munich, and as a contact of the Czech Sra LAZINA, who was arrested by US authorities, apparently for espionage, on 10 Sep 46. Another of LAZINA's contacts in Munich was (Dr) Sra MROZ, Bad Brunhallstr. 3, who told a woman companion to keep LAZINA out of Munich because the Americans were going to arrest him. Amazon MSC 135; 2 Oct 45; also CIB file, LIS 554, 1 Oct 46. Neither of these documents can be located in COM files.
