1. Synopsis of Developments:

*who she?*

a. ABCAPELIN/1: There were 14 meetings with ABCAPELIN/1 during the reporting period when attention was centered primarily on Czeslawa MIKITA who has been confiding in ABCAPELIN/1 regularly about developments regarding her contacts with [ ] [ ] Following a number of interrogation sessions, during which she was led to believe that the AIS suspected her, she became apprehensive about her status and on one occasion revealed her AIS contact to Ivan KASUBA, her ostensible motive being to determine if the AIS has sources in POLAND who could provide data on her background. Apparently fearing the AIS would detain her illegally, she passed to ABCAPELIN/1 a letter and a package with another letter and her personal documents which she asked him to forward to her relatives in Hamburg in the event the AIS arrested her; and she also asked him to begin a campaign locally to effect her release. The letter and the package were borrowed from ABCAPELIN/1 for examination and reproduction of the contents. She has at times made slips to ABCAPELIN/1 which tend to support suspicions that she was dispatched to Munich by an Eastern IS but no substantial results have been gained via interrogation primarily because of the "voluntary" nature of her collaboration with the AIS which restricts us considerably. ABCAPELIN/1 has been instructed to continue his friendly contact with her until further notice. In addition to his reporting on MIKITA, ABCAPELIN/1 reported on a number of sources of CI interest. He was consulted regarding his status per Headquarters Request and he indicated his preferences regarding his future service with the AIS.

b. ABCAPELIN/2: One meeting was held with ABCAPELIN/2 whose reporting performance continued favorably as has been the case during the past number of months.

2. Major Developments:

a. Czeslawa MIKITA: ABCAPELIN/1 continued working with MIKITA on the pretext that he wanted her services for purposes of research on the

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c. He says he is at our disposition and if it is our wish to transfer him his European choices are Greece, Turkey and France, in that order. Because of the need for men of his profession in Greece and Turkey he feels that he will have no problem in effecting a transfer to those countries. (Here he mentioned that there is also a need for his profession in Brazil which has one of the greatest Uke emigre concentrations in the world.) Regarding Paris, he referred to his earlier discussions (in 1955) when it was proposed to him that he be transferred to Paris. He feels he will encounter similar difficulties regarding transfer and cover which he said will not permit him to make an effective contribution till such basic difficulties are overcome.

d. Again he said that such are his personal wishes but he is fully willing to take up any proposal which is made to him. He was made to understand that his personal views will be given full consideration but that there can be no assurance that the situation will exist according to his wishes. AEGAPLIN/1 then repeated that our command will be his wish but that for the time being he would like to remain in Munich, etc.

5. IS-60-21, 21-10-1957, re: JERZY CIEPIL During WASHUEA's talk with... he was going to look up a fru CIEPIL, who was born in Poland in 1956 or 1957, was deported from Poland and returned to Munich, probably in late 1957. WASHUEA's information indicates the German deported him on suspicion of having been recruited by the CB. CIEPIL reportedly was contacted by the CB after he was deported and then permitted to leave Poland legally. KASHIDA suspects the passport now in CIEPIL's hands may have been issued through the grace of the CB and feels that a comparison of CIEPIL's passport with MYKITA's passport may provide some enlightening information about MYKITA. (Note that AEGENKLEE earlier reported fru CIEPIL's presence at BARDEJA headquarters; see BEMA-28349, 9 Oct 1957 and BUMA-29364, 13 Nov 1957. See also AEGARTHOGE/13 files material for other mentions of various individuals bearing the family name. CIEPIL.)

6. AECAPELIN/1's Health: Following AECAPELIN/1's physical examination in January 1958, he confided that he was sexually impotent and asked if [ ] could consult with his office medical staff regarding therapy for this malady. Following this [ ] advised AECAPELIN/1 that there is a preparation on the German market, identified as Sano-Sex, (as was taken by [ ]) which is highly recommended for AECAPELIN/1's purpose. AECAPELIN/1 said the medicine did the trick. Likewise, he accepted the American doctor's advice and sought treatment for his nervous condition. Thus far, he has taken five shots of a series of ten shots which are supposed to rejuvenate his nerves and take care of his vitamin deficiency. He said jokingly that perhaps he has felt better due to psychological reasons but feels that the treatments he has been getting have been responsible for his much better condition. To illustrate, he said that since he has been working on the MYKITA case, he has been forced to work under pressure and has had to retire at very late hours. Ordinarily, he would have experienced sleeplessness and severe headaches, etc. Now, he sleeps wonderfully and has no other ailments.
