CAPELIN STATUS

1. Synopals of Developments:

ARCAPRILIVIE There were ill meetings with ARCAPRILIVI during the reporting period when attention was centered primarily on Genelaus MIXITA who has been confiding in ARGPRITE/1 regularly about developments arding her contects with Pollowing a number of interrog tion sessions, during which she was led to believe that the AIS suspec hor, she became apprehensive about her status and on one coossion revealed her ATS contact to Ivan KASHUBA, her ostensible motive being to determine if the AIR has sources in Poland who could provide data on her besignound. Apparently fearing the AIS would detain her illegally, she passed to ANGAPHIN/1 a letter and a pankage with another letter and her personal documents which she asked him to forward to her relatives in Hamburg in the event the AIS arrested her; and she also asked him to begin a compaign locally to effect her release. The letter and the package were borrowed from ARCAPKINI/1 for exemination and reproduction of the contents. She has at times made slips to AECAPKLIN/1 which tend to support suspicious that she was dispatched to Munich by an Eastern IS but no substantial results have been gained via interrogation primarily because of the "considered" meture of her collaboration with the ALS which restricts us consideredly. ARCAPELIN/1 has been instructed to continue his friendly contact with her until further notice. In addition to his reporting on MUNITA, ARAPHILIVI reported on a number of enteres of ON interest. He was consulted regarding his status per Headquarters request and he indicated his preferences regarding his future service with the AIS.

b. ANCAPELITY/2: One meeting was held with ARCAPELITY's whose reporting performance continued favorably as has been the case during the past mamber of months

He left the material with AECAPELIN/1 and asked him to write an opinion on MIXITA based on his observations and the material KASHUBA last him. KASHUBA indicated that he will take up with MIXITA when the AIS

lets her go.

b. KASHUBA pretended he would look for a job for her at Zeppelinstrasse 67 but told AECAPELIN/1 that he will never permit her to work at Z67 since he has learned that the AIS suspects her.

c. ARCAPELIN/1 will present a written account of KASHUBA's information at a later date. Further comments will be found in the next MIKITA

contact report.

d. In view of the foregoing, ARCAPELIN/1 was requested to write a review of his security vis-a-vis MYKITA, FASHUBA, et al, which was discussed with him at this contact. From this discussion, it does not appear that his security has not been affected and he agreed to write this report in full understanding.

2. ARCAPELIN/1's Status: Per DIR-13451, dated 19 March 1958, ARCAPELIN/1 was presented with the questions as described in EGMM-5525, dated 22 January 1958, paragraph 5. ARCAPELIN/1's replies, which he was requested to present in written form were as follows:

a. He desires to remain in Munich where he is well established visavis his cover and sources and where Ukrainian emigres are still an import-

ent RIS target.


b, He does not wish to retire permanently or temporarily and in view of this does not wish to emigrate to the United States as yet.



e. He says he is at our disposition and if it is our wish to transfer him his European choices are Greece, Turkey and France, in that drier. Because of the need for men of his profession in Greece and Turkey he feels that he will have no problem in effecting a transfer to those dountries. (Here he mentioned that there is also a need for his profession in Brazil which has one of the greatest Une emigre concentrations in the world.) Regarding Paris, he referred to his earlier discussions (in 1955) when it was proposed to him that he be transferred to Paris. He feels he will encounter similar difficulties regarding transfer and power which he said will not permit him to make an effective contribution till such basic difficulties are overcome.

He was made to understand that his personal views will be given full consideration but that there can be no assurance that the situation will exist according to his wishes. AECAPELIN/1 then repeated that our command will be his wish but that for the time being he would like to remain in Munich, etc.

AECAPELIN/1's health: Following AECAPELIN/1's physical examination in January 1976, he contined that he was sexually impotent and asked if [] could consult with his office medical staff regarding therapy for this malady. Following this [] advised AECAPELIN/1 that there is a preparation on the German market, identified as Sano-Sex, (as was taken by [] which is highly reconvended for AECAPELIN/1's purpose. AECAPELIN/1 said the medicane did the trick. Likewise, he accepted the American doctor's advice and sought treatment for his nervous condition.
