Henry BREYERBORN, et al

Reference: WGLA-7399

Information extracted from the files of OIG on the individuals mentioned in reference is set out below:

a. Henry BREYERBORN, born 9 February 1928, no place of birth given, residence: Alexanderstrasse 8, Götting, member of the KPD. (Source: Information card, dtd 12 Oct 48, evaluation: 3-2). Subject is no doubt identical with ~~Henry BREYERBORN~~, born 19 February 1928 in Dorpat/Estland, who was apprehended by the American Border Police, along with one hundred other people, crossing the Soviet-American zone border after attending a KPD/SED meeting. Date of arrest not shown in OIG's file.

b. Franz GROSCHKE, born 29 January 1897 in Schneidemühl, has been a member of the German police since 1921. He held the position of Chief of the Homicide Bureau in Berlin from 1930 to 1939. Subject entered the Wehrmacht in August 1939 and was assigned to the Gebirgs-Polizei with the rank of Major. He was the GEP Director for Army Group South, which operated in Eastern Hungary and Southern Austria. At present GROSCHKE is thought to be working for an unidentified U.S. intelligence agency. (Source: Arrest Report, dtd 20 June 1945 and information card, dated 2 August 1951. Evaluation: 3-3)

c. Wilhelm KRIGER, born 7 May 1896 in Wiesbaden, served in WW I from 1914 to 1918 as an Unteroffizier. After the armistice he was actively affiliated with several para-military organizations, including Vikarband in 1923, Wehrwolf in 1924, Bund Oberland in 1925-1928, and Brigade Ehrhardt. From 1928-1933 Subject lived in BRESDEN and worked mostly as a salesman. From 1928 to 1930 he received part-time training with the Reichwehr as platoon, company, and battalion commander. In June 1933 he was appointed Hauptmann in the Schutzpolizei in Bresden and subsequently in October he was assigned to the Police Central Office in Sudetenland. In 1934 Subject was made border inspector for Southeast Germany and in this capacity became a member of the RSHA Amt I and IV. In the spring of 1938 he was appointed Regierungsverst and Kriminalrat. In the spring of 1939 he was made Oberregierungsrat. KRIGER joined the NSDAP in 1937, the Allgemeine SS in 1937 with the rank of Untersturmführer, and in 1940 was promoted to Oberführer. (Source: Information cards, dtd 7 Sept 1950, 17 July 1951 and 24 Aug 51; serials 3-6)
