MEMORALIDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Wolfgang Franz ROBINOW

- 1. During meeting with GKRUG at Haus Wagner this date, 821 was shown a calling card with SUBJECT's name printed thereon. GRUG stated that he had first know SUBJECT at Deggendorf at the end of WW II. SUBJECT, a former U.S. officer, returned to Germany as a civilian employee. During 1954, SUBJECT returned from Turkey and was stationed in Salzburg, living at Schloss Weitworth bei Salzburg, at which time EXRUG renewed his acquaintance, collected stamps together, etc. In 1955, SUBJECT called at GRUG's home in Bad Reichenhall but EXRUG was not at home.
- 2. CRNG requested 621 to determine whether SUBJECT is still in Europe, and if in Germany. CRNG stated that this was a matter of personal interest to him and had no connection with 900 duties.
- 3. When CARUG first showed SUBJECT's card to S21, he acted as though he expected 821 to be acquainted with SUBJECT based on former service in Salzburg.
- 4. 821 promised to check on SUBJECT and advise. (841 please advise recommended reply to GREUG.)
