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- 3. The POSCER/VEHER files from which the above information was taken contain no indication that PONCER had UPRILL ties outside of the framework described in para. 2, i.e., saids from those developed through KRICHBAIM. The most that can be suggested, therefore, is a check on those kRICHBAIM in the most that can be suggested, therefore, is a check on those masses which reportedly were subject of discussion between POMCER and KRICHBAUM and possibly BORTIL. In addition to GROSCHEK and NOETH, these included Roman LOOS, former subordinate of KRICHBAUM in the Geheimfeld-polises with whom KRICHBAUM maintained contact and who also was in tough with POMCER; Benerich OFCZARIK GSCHAFFER; Josef URBAN; and the following HORTIL contacts listed in Power Scots dated a March 1953: won PRAEKEBEEG, fau: Fran DREIHAUFT; HORLER, fau; Hildsgard REETZ; HAUJOCKS, fau. There is no roster of Germans with whom POMCER came into contact at Ruremberg or of those about whom he later "reminisced" at length with both KRICHBAUM and HOETTL, and no way of determining the extent of the information which KRICHBAUM provided POMCER additional to what he admitted in general terms under interrogation. Few of the "details" requested by GREHMHARDE, in sum, are on record.
- t. Of tangential interest in connection with . There the following items which were noted in passing in the POSCHEN/VERBER files:
  - a. PORCER claimed that the purpose of his meeting with HOETTL was to locate Adolf HICHMANN and to obtain information on "neo-Basi activities and his Soviet superiors." This statement is as it appears in a debriefing report and there is no further elaboration.
  - b. PONCER stated that HORTTL once remarked that Gestapo MUNILER was living in Ralle, Soviet Zone, in hiding. According to PONCER, the Russians were very interested in this information and pressed for more details, which were not forthcoming. (The HORTTL interrogution countains the statement that on his first visit PONCER wanted to know the whereabouts of Reinrich MUNILER, who had disappeared, and especially MUNILER's deputy, Adolf EICHEARE.)
  - c. In addition to Eminrich MUKILER, the RIS wanted FORGER to try to develop information on the following former 98 personnel: Dr. PARFFER, former 88 intelligence officer with responsibility for coverage of the United States, Canada and Japan; QESCHER, fms, reportedly serving with the Volkspolized in East Germany.

While the above tidbits may have a small interest, it should be noted that statements made by POSCER cannot be given a whole lot of weight, as he was at no times cooperative under interrugation and it can be assumed that whatever he said was said for his own purposes or because he had to say scorething.

5. Additionally, and for whatever it is worth, it perhaps should be mentioned that the addressbook of walter LAUBER, who was associated with the GIS activity of PORGER, contained the following two entries:
