In addition to the Biographical Information Sheet, attached herewith, KUFALM/BR files contain the following references to Subject:

a. The Committee for Nuclear Technology, whose primary responsibility is to plan for the application of nuclear energy in the power industry, was established 24 January 1956. Prof. Dr. Karl KUEPFMUELLER is a member of the Executive Board.

b. West Germany has received the majority of research contracts from the European Office of USAF's Air Research and Defense Command. A \$3,000 contract was let to the University of Darmstadt for Investigation of Servomechanisms of the Human Body. The principal investigator was Dr. KUEPFMUELLER. Article in American Aviation Daily, June 1954.

c. In September 1952, a symposium on German World War II radar countermeasures was held under the auspices of the Scientific and Technical Unit, COMNAVFOR. The purposes of the symposium were to complete the history and scientific picture of German developments; to obtain an accounting of the present activities of personnel connected with the German program; to weigh conflicting information that had been obtained

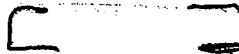

from some of the participating scientists and to add to information on Soviet potential for exploiting this German development. Among the German scientists in attendance was Prof. Dr. Ing. Karl KUEFFMEYER, Technische Hochschule, Darmstadt.

4. Information dated August 1947 stated that Professor KUEFFMEYER was an advisor to the Section for Research, Developments and Patents of the German Navy. He also headed a staff of scientific advisors to Admiral Doenitz. In the last two years of the war, KUEFFMEYER and his several committees succeeded in developing the XXI and XXVI class submarines for large scale raids. He is now in Wolfenbuettel as head of a scientific staff of the German Navy.
