

YOKOHAMA file

A YOKOHAMA article dated 23 March (year unknown), and entitled "YOKOHAMA  
Not Flays Landing Rules; Suspected As a War Criminal for Japanese-German Unity  
Plan; Released Afterwards" is quoted as follows:

YOKOHAMA came from Fukuoka-ken and is sixty-seven years old. He first entered  
the ONTO-REI, an ultra-rightist body, as a follower of TOSIYA NISHIZUMI and be-  
came closely associated with HIROKA KIKUCHI. He established the so-called "Civil  
Information Department" and says it was he who established the Japanese-German  
Anti-Communism Front in Japan with SYUNJI ITO (the then special German envoy to  
Japan). He received aid from HIROKA KIKUCHI. He was detained in Sugamo Pri-  
son as a Class "B" war criminal suspect immediately after the war but was later  
released. He is now living in a big mansion at Chigasaki 2nd Chugoku-ken.

ONERI Taketaka, former Prosecutor for the Tokyo District Court and present (as of  
1946) Prosecutor of Niigata District Court was interviewed at the offices of the Na-  
tional Prosecutor on 10 December 1954. When questioned with regard to the subject's  
sources of income, ONERI stated that he believed that SHINGOYAMA Shogji, HI-  
NASHI Fumimasa, and AIZUMI Yoshinobu were his principal business partners and that they  
helped to manage business transactions through YOKOHAMA's connections, as well as  
valuable advice and information from him.
