## COMMENTS/RECOMMENDATIONS:

Subject has been enrolled in the Civil Service Retirement system only since 22 December 1967. However, because of his contract status in September 1952 it is believed that the period 5 September 1952 to 31 December 1954 can be certified for Civil Service credit. Should Subject retire in December 1970, when he will be 65 years of age, he will have over 5 years credit in the Civil Service Retirement system which will make him oligible for an annuity. This annuity will be small but added to his annuity from Social Security will provide him with approximately \$250 per this suggested that Subject receive an annuity from which will bring his total retirement income up to the amount which he would receive from the Civil Service system if he had been enrolled since his EOD - 5 September 1952!

Subject is not operationally useful because he cannot accept PCS assignments since his wife is employed in New York. Subject is also restricted for TDYs because of medical reasons.

In a discussion with CPD it was determined that Subject could qualify for a supplemental annuity under the formula established by the Agency. Should Subject retire December 1970 he could qualify for his Civil Service annuity of \$85 per month plus his Social Security annuity of approximately \$200 per month which is a total of \$285 per month. If Subject had been enrolled in Civil Service since his EOD of 5 September 1952 and based on a high three salary of \$14,000 he would qualify for a Civil Service annuity of \$403 per month. This is \$118 more than his present combined Civil Service and Social Security. The supplemental annuity would amount to approximately \$1,400 per year.

The resolution of this case as determined by the Non-Staff Personnel Management Committee during its 2-3 December meeting and concurred in by Chief, SB on 12 December 1969 is as follows:

"SA/NSP is asking Contract Personnel Division to determine if certain "dead time" can be credited toward Civil Service credit. If he receives credit for this period, he will have-the 5 years necessary for retirement under an immediate annuity on 30 June 1970. The PMC recommends that he retire on that date."
