The above named individual underwent a routine medical examination at my office on 27 July 1952.

- a. History: 1935- Scarlet Fever - no known residua.  
1936 - Pneumonia - uneventful recovery.  
Frequent episodes of tonsillitis, last, 1948. At age 15 he was said to have an enlarged heart and a murmur. Turned down by German Army because of this "heart trouble". Complains of sticking pains over his heart and sighing respirations. No complaints suggestive of heart disease.  
1944- Bullet wound, left palm.
- b. Physical Examination: Both ear drums scarred and slightly retracted. Functional systolic murmur over base of heart - no evidence of heart disease. Multiple caries and several unextracted roots.
- c. Laboratory Studies: Chest x-ray, urinalysis, and serologic test for syphilis, all were within normal limits.
- d. Disposition: Qualified for full duty following correction of existing dental defects.

Though this man has no organic heart disease, he does have a functional cardiac syndrome known as neuro-circulatory asthenia. The background for this problem is usually a basic conflict concerning the activity in which the individual is engaged. There are usually no symptoms when there is no conflict. However, should problems arise, he will have more troubles.
