Evaluation of Agents:

a. Effectiveness

(1) Capabilities in Terms of Project: Project terminated—decision was made not to encourage continuation of BDJ under any sponsorship. Factions of the BDJ have been taken over by other youth organizations and Land Bavaria founded a new organization. The BDJ, as we knew it is dead. Hollocks assured the ease officer however, that he manuax could rally thousands of ex BDJ members around him or a cause he endorses, anytime he wanted to.

(2) Effectiveness in Terms of Project: See termination report.

(3) Efficiency of Agents See agent evaluation report. Agent, during a meeting in April made the statement that he relied too much on the guidance we gave him. He added that by following the Pro-American line too closely he seriously endangered the security of the project, and many personal enemies. The beginning the project, and many personal enemies.

Specific Remarks on Sub-Agents:

Mony sub-agents had no concept of security measures, and violated security constantly. But since the EDJ was organized along democratic lines, i.e., officials were elected, it was difficult to remove undesireable implements.

Security of Operations:

a. Any crossing of Operations: The BDJ was involved in so many operations, that at one time or another they crossed with practically every PP operation that was being conducted in CErnany.

b. Liaison with other Security forces (U.S. Allied, Stc.)

The BDJ was the target of almost every security agency in GErmany. It has his been definitely established that CIC, at various times attempted to penetrate both the Apparat and the BDJ. The BDj was also the target of almost every SPD dominated Police Department or investigative agency.

Outlook for the Future: There is no future for the BDJ. The ix one assest we in Terms of Gain, U.S. Risk could possibly have salvaged was the Sov Zone net. But this also in no longer possible. The net is now thoroughly blown, and various groups comprising the net have joined other organizations.
