- a. (1) Membership in the Bund Deutscher Jugend (League of German Youth) (BDJ) now stands at an all time high of 8,942, an increase of 119 members since the last reporting period.
- (2) In order to counteract the effects of the recent Wienoller visit to the Soviet Union the BDJ displayed a huge placard reading "Back to Moscow" in front of Wienoller's Wiesbaden residence. This action brought forth ample press comment, but the action was in no manner attributed to the BDJ. In conjunction with the Volksbund für Frieden und Freiheit (League for Peace and Freedom)(VFF), the BDJ held a mass meeting in Giessen to protest recent activities of Wienoller and ex-Chancellor Wirth. Distribution of 100,000 gray leaflets asserting that Wienoller had called for a boycott of the Communist press was begun on 20 January 1952.
- (3) The political cabaret group, organized by the BDJ under OPC direction, continues to give regular performances accenting the all-out struggle against Communism.
- (4) The BDJ-initiated youth delegation to the United Nations was received in Paris by a member of the UN Secretariat in charge of non-governmental organizations. Copies of the memorandum on the para-military training of the Communist Freie Deutsche Jugend (Free German Youth) (FDJ) were sent to all the various delegations attending the UN. This action was suggested by the official West German observer at the UN as the appropriate means to have the item eventually placed on the agenda.
- (5) The national chairman and the local chapter of the BDJ in Bavaria brought civil suit against a Communist newspaper in Hesse for implicating the BDJ in recent bombing incidents in West Germany. The court ordered the newspaper to desist from publishing such accusations or characterizing the BDJ as "terroristic." The BDJ in Hesse has now launched a campaign to discourage advertising in this paper. Through BDJ channels a complete report dealing with the present para-military training schedules of the

carrying out OPC policy is gratifying. The Soviet Zone press and radio have stepped up their attacks on the BQJ, thus illustrating the effectiveness of the organization.

LOPKOWL Apparat

With resistance policy in West Germany still beclouded by the pending contractual agreements, no significant activity has been undertaken by the Apparat in this area. Recruitment and organization are proceeding slowly in the East Zone.
