a. (1) The objective of this project is to promote throughout Germany a nation-wide youth movement in order to:							
a) Develop a mass organization as an OPC controlled instrument for political warfare activities in both East and West Germany, which will be able to combat leftist and rightist extremism among the younger generation.							
b) Publish a periodical and other propaganda material primarily addressed to the youth for overt distribution in West Germany.							
c) Secure a manpower pool for possible future partisan and sabotage actions.							
The original project outline was approved on 13 July 1950. <small>This document is part of an integrated file and should not be removed from the file. It must be subjected to individual systematic review.</small>							
(2) The Bund Deutscher Jugend (League of German Youth), (BDJ), is a corporation engaged in fighting communism and neutralism both in Western and Eastern Germany. In addition, the organization is being employed to promote U. S. objectives in Western Germany such as rearmament, the Schuman Plan, and other questions pertaining to West German integration into the European economy. During the reporting period, membership rose by 145, bringing the total to 8,201.							
From 8-15 August, the Land - leaders of the BDJ met in Berlin. In numerous conversations with members of the Communist Freie Deutsche Jugend (Free German Youth), (FDJ), it became apparent that members of the FDJ were well aware of the BDJ and that they had received BDJ propaganda.							
On 20 August, the BDJ summer camp program concluded. Between 9 July and 20 August, approximately 400 members of the BDJ took part. During the reporting period, teachers at the BDJ's political school were engaged in speaking tours and took part in the Berlin meeting. As a result, no scheduled classes were offered.

A delegation of 18 members of the EDJ took part in a trip to Italy from 27 July to 9 August. Activities of the delegation included a banquet, and a private audience with the Pope. He spoke with each member personally and as a remembrance gave each of them a papal medallion. Foreign Minister deGasperi was presented with an album containing the most important publications of the EDJ.

Distribution of propaganda material by the EDJ during the reporting period included the following: 60,000 copies of "Information Service", 450,000 stickers, 350,000 leaflets, 20,000 pamphlets and 3,000 posters - a total of 883,000 items.
