1. Attached draft of a plan for continuing East Zone activities after liquidation of the EDJ was prepared by Kenneth P. Hollocks in December 1952. He was dissuaded at that time from attempting to divorce or segregate any EDJ activities, and was instructed that the EDJ will be dealt with as a single package.

2. The plan in its present form and concept, and with the proposed utilization of the personalities named, is entirely unfeasible. However, certain phases of the plan are well conceived and operational techniques presented are sound. The necessity for the type of activity discussed is self-evident, and although the plan in its entirety may never be put into effect, certain aspects of the project could well be the basis for future Sov Zone operations.
