(3) Case Officer instructed Agent:

1. Instructed Hollocks to tell [] the following:

a. He should under no circumstances perjure himself, consequently he must either answer questions truthfully, or state that he does not know, cannot remember, etc.

b. That he worked specifically for [] , but should admit that he was aware [] is an American.

c. That he committed no illegal acts - all instructions were issued by [] which he executed.

d. Queries regarding the lists should be explained exactly as he had previously done during questioning by Federal judges.

e. To volunteer no information, raise objections to questions that appear irrelevant, but if forced to answer, do so; applying the advice stated in para. "a" above.

2. Instructed Hollocks to abide by the following in the event that his lawyer received erroneous information, and they do have to give testimony.

a. He should maintain throughout, and without let-up, that KMPRUDE and the "Technical Service" are in no way connected, affiliated, or related.

b. That he had never met [] (stated to Case Officer that he did in actuality never meet [] - socially or otherwise) and that [] never issued instructions to KMPRUDE, nor did he have any contact with the organization.

c. That he should admit American backing only if his "back is against the wall" - and then it should be construed as support from private anonymous American sources.

d. If queried regarding demands made on the KMPRUDE in return for funds received he should state that the donators made no specific demands other than a request that the

1. Ascertained from Hollocks that Charles F. Prettyman, Sidney F. Eckford, and Paul L. Measor have had no connection whatsoever with the Apparat.

2. Not directly concerned with the issue under discussion, but nevertheless of consequence - Hollocks stated, in reply to my query, that he expects to obtain his divorce on 13 February 1953. The children will be in the custody of their mother. Hollocks has assumed responsibility for the separation and divorce.

funds be utilized to further the aims of KMPRUDE as provided for in the charter. (The Case Officer made it clear to Hollocks that he should not state more than is necessary.

e. To remind his lawyer that questions regarding the identity of the donators is really irrelevant to the case. To admit that American funds were obtained (in addition to funds from many other sources, e.g., German Industry, contributions, dues, etc.) only if the question is put to him in such a way that he must answer it.

f. To keep in touch with Prettyman, Eckford, and Measor and to brief them prior to the hearing scheduled on the morning of 2 February 1953.
