<p>REPORT from FBI - Encl. 2</p> <p>The following excerpt is extracted verbatim from the above referenced document:</p> <p>WALTER MARIA KOTSCHNIG, born April 9, 1901, Judenburg, Austria, came to the United States 1936; naturalized June 15, 1942. Employed Department of State since June 6, 1944. Has served as Advisor to United States Delegations to various UN conferences; has also served as United States representative to UN conferences. Drafted policy papers on United States proposals at Dumbarton Oaks; drafted UN organization chart. Served as Advisor to Dean VIRGINIA GILDERSLEEVE and Representative SOL BLOOM, San Francisco conference. T-1 advises KOTSCHNIG General Secretary of International Student Service from 1925 to 1933; reported to have been responsible for attendance of ROEHM, HIMMLER and JOHANNES VON LEERS at meetings. ....</p> <p>....</p> <p>The records of T-1, another Governmental agency conducting intelligence and security investigations, reflect that on September 20, 1944, T-1 advised it had learned from a source considered reliable, though somewhat biased, that KOTSCHNIG was responsible for the attendance of ROEHM and HIMMLER at a meeting of the International Student Service held at Garmisch Partenkirchen, Germany. According to this source, at another meeting of the International Student Service in 1933 or 1934, this time in the Netherlands, KOTSCHNIG was reported to have been responsible for the attendance of JOHANNES VON LEERS, Head of the Nazi Pagan Movement, who was expelled from the gathering. KOTSCHNIG is also said to have been responsible, according to the same source, for the International Student Service's sending money to help German students in 1933, much of which fell into Nazi hands.</p> <p>....</p>
