- In Buenos Aires it is known time Johannes von Leers, one of the most andent Nazi propagandists, made his way to Argentina under the name of Dr. Hans A. Euler, after the collapse of Germany. Under the pseudonym "K. Heubert", he wrote a review of world politics with an openly anti-Semitic slent for the evowed National Socialist newspaper Der Weg. During Nazi times, is had a book published: Juden sehen Dich an ("Jows, Look et Tourselves).
- The press office of the Employers' Federation amounced that it had not been sware that Dr. von Leers concealed himself behind the pseydonym "Dr. Hand ... Auler."

 Dr. Euler was pointed out to the editors of Der Arbeitsgeber, upon inquiry from readers in Argentina, as a person suitable to write an article about application conditions in Argentina upon the death of Ewa Peron.
