1. Der Arbeitgeber, the organ of the Federation of German Employers' Associations (Bundesvereinigung der deutschen Arbeitgeberverbände), in its No. 15-16 issue, fourth annual volume, had an article titled "What Eva Peron Meant to Argentina," Dr. Hans A. Euler appeared as the author.
2. In Buenos Aires it is known that Johannes von Leers, one of the most ardent Nazi propagandists, made his way to Argentina under the name of Dr. Hans A. Euler, after the collapse of Germany. Under the pseudonym "K. Meubert", he wrote a review of world politics with an openly anti-Semitic slant for the avowed National Socialist newspaper Der Weg. During Nazi times, he had a book published: Juden sehen Dich an ("Jews, Look at yourselves").
3. The press office of the Employers' Federation announced that it had not been aware that Dr. von Leers concealed himself behind the pseudonym "Dr. Hans A. Euler." Dr. Euler was pointed out to the editors of Der Arbeitgeber, upon inquiry from readers in Argentina, as a person suitable to write an article about socialistic conditions in Argentina upon the death of Eva Peron.
