trial and the President's pardon.

It sets forth - perhaps for the first time -
the history of the development of the Presidential
Sanction in national security cases.

The ex-FBI association, with whom we
have excellent relations, have taken 8,000 copies
for their membership.

Our next report will deal with the
Senate Internal Security Subcommittee - not necessarily
as it is presently concerned - and how it could serve
us in counterintelligence previously. Through our

Legislative connections we could furnish them
 primary witnesses who put useful intelligence into
 the public domain. At present, the media has
 taken on that role with a bias that mutilates
 stories that become there is no other credible
 channel which can take testimony under oath.

We have a fat agenda which will
 explore other aspects of intelligence, estimation
 and growing contradictions which arise in the
 blurred line that is supposed to distinguish the
 respective powers of the executive and the legislature.
