(TS//(b)(3) //NF, In furtherance of our telephone conversation earlier this week, please provide the Central Intelligence Agency with your legal conclusion that utilizing the following interrogation techniques with detainee Janat Gul would not violate any U.S. statute, including 18 U.S.C. § 2340A, nor would it violate the U.S. Constitution or any treaty obligation of the United States, including Article 16 of the Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman, or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, adopted Dec. 10, 1984, S. Treaty Doc. No. 100-20 (1988) (entered into force June 26, 1987):

- Dietary manipulation (so long as the intake is calculated to maintain the general health of the detainee)
- Nudity
- Water Dousing
- Abdominal Slap.

As discussed in our previous correspondence regarding Gul, his interrogation takes place outside territory subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
