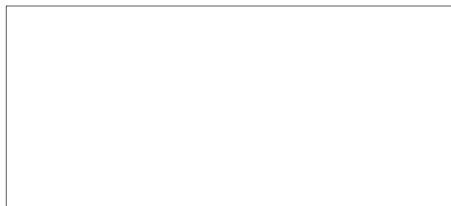

In the event you wish to write [redacted] re the [redacted] surveys, (b)(3)
I am quoting extract from Diary for 5 Oct 1948, for possible comment
in your letter:

[redacted] (tele) - Telephoned from Adm Mills' office. (b)(3)
[redacted] was in town for the day and wanted to call on DCI to
pay his respects. He also had a few items to pass on regarding (b)(3)
[redacted] which he could very well give our New
Orleans man. Told him General Wright was acting DCI and was sure (b)(3)
he would be very happy to see him and I offered to send a car for
him. [redacted] thanked for this offer but ask that I pass on to (b)(3)
DCI his regards. At same time, I mentioned that the three volumes
on [redacted] had arrived several days subsequent to DCI's departure -
thanked him for sending them. [redacted] stated that our people were extracting (b)(3)
information from it and that there might be a delay in returning
them to him and hoped that it would not cause him any inconvenience.
