My dear Mr. Dulles:

In August 1952, the Senate Small Business Committee published a report prepared by the Federal Trade Commission on the international oil cartel. The report has been the subject of considerable discussion since its publication.

Our Committee has been particularly interested in the comments of the Lebanon Daily Star, an English language newspaper published in Beirut, Lebanon. We would like to determine the financial support of this newspaper. We have received information that it is published by the former head of the German propaganda agency in Lebanon, who spent most of World War II in Germany.

I am sure that the Central Intelligence Agency undoubtedly uses the Lebanon Daily Star as a source of information on public opinion in the Middle East. In evaluating this newspaper's comments, you have undoubtedly checked on its backing. I would appreciate any information that the CIA has as to who actually supports this newspaper. In the event that the CIA has no information, would it be possible to investigate this matter?
