The Review Panel, having duly deliberated upon all the facts and documentary evidence submitted in support of the application of the above-mentioned Subject for admission into the United States under the Displaced Persons Act of 1948, as amended, as and for its unanimous decision of rejection under Section 13, finds:

Subject is (was) a member of, or participated in, a movement which is (was) hostile to the United States or its form of government, since the Subject was area chief of the Sicherheitspolizei and was under the control of the Gestapo during the war years. According to Intelligence Service, men who were in authority in these organizations were generally there because of their known Nazi sympathies.
