On 18 November 1952 CIC Central Files were reviewed at Ft. Holabird, Maryland. Dossier #169382 in Subject's name disclosed an index card dated 7 July 1947 from Headquarters, CIC Region IV, in which the following biographical information was set forth:

NAME: Alexandras _____

FILE: DP 48/9308; EC 66158; RD 404

ADDRESS: DP Camp, Pionier Kaserne, Littenwald, Bl. II/49.

BIRTH: 10 June 1907 at Vaiguva/Lithuania

OCCUPATION: Field laborer

MISCELLANEOUS: Shows derogatory information on file at CIC Visa Section and Berlin Document Center, 19 September 1949.

An index card dated 23 February 1951, origin not indicated, contains the notation, "List #28 of cases rejected under Section 13 of Public Law 774."

A letter from the 970th CIC Detachment dated 13 May 1947 to the Deputy Theatre Judge for War Crimes, 7708 War Crimes Group, APO 178, U. S. Army, reflects that it had recently been reported that Subject was the Chief of the political Lithuanian Security Police in Vilna during the German occupation and that he was possibly connected with the shooting of Jews in Vilna. At the date of the letter he was living as a Lithuanian DP in UMRRA Camp #6, Bamberg. A check of records available to the 970th CIC Detachment failed to reveal any record of Subject; however, it was considered possible that he might have been wanted because of his former activities.

A letter dated 17 June 1947 from the 970th CIC Detachment to CIC Region VI stated that the Office of the Chief Counsel for War Crimes had advised that it had no interest in Subject.

A letter dated 4 December 1950 from the DP Coordinator for Europe to Subject advised him that his application for admission to the United States had been rejected by the Review Panel of the Displaced Persons Commission.
