Sisco: No, I'm not sure. You can get six in September if we have an interim agreement and a Middle East package up there it will go forward I think.

Eagleburger: Is the Charge out there any good?

Vance: Yes, it's changing Sunday.

Eagleburger: Who is it?

Vance: Walker. After the two visits I think he's OK.

Eagleburger: I thought we weren't going to do that. It worries me on the basis of what I knew four years ago about Walker.

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Vance: You may have to go back out again.

The Secretary: I've been here for three years, who's replacing me?

Cutler: Cutler is at least an activist.

The Secretary: All right. I need a recommendation for the President.
