SUBJECT: Discussion of Vietnam Plans

Until further notice, I want no discussions by Government officials with the media concerning future U.S. troop withdrawal plans or U.S. plans for maintaining a residual force in South Vietnam. This applies to discussions with the press, either on or off the record, background briefings and informal speculation.

I expect each of you to insure that this guidance is implemented throughout your Department/Agency.
