(1) NYTIMES (KANDELL FROM LIMA) -- "KISSINGER IN LIMA ON HIS LATIN TOUR" (PAGE 17)

"SECRETARY KISSINGER . . . SPOKE APPROVINGLY OF THE NONALIGNMENT POLICY OF THE PERUVIAN LEFT-WING MILITARY GOVERNMENT, BUT REMINDED HIS HOSTS THAT THEY WERE 'PART OF THE WESTERN HEMISPHERE.'

". . . MR. KISSINGER ARRIVED . . . WHEN A SEVERE ECONOMIC CRISIS HAS FORCED PERU TO SEEK WARMER TIES WITH THE U.S.

". . . PRECEDING HIS VISIT, PERU . . . PRIVATELY EXPRESSED HOPES THE SECRETARY COULD AID THEM . . . TO RECEIVE MORE LOANS AND CREDITS . . . AND THAT A STRONG STATEMENT OF SUPPORT FROM (KISSINGER) WOULD GIVE THE REGIME A RESPONSIBLE IMAGE IN THE EYES OF WESTERN BANKERS.

". . . THE PERUVIAN MILITARY HAS EMERGED AS THE LEADING EXPONENT OF THIRD-WORLD VIEWS . . . NO, IT DID NOT DISTRIBUTE FOOD PRIMARILY OR EVEN SUBSTANTIALLY FOR POLITICAL BENEFIT. CHARGES AGAINST THE CIA WERE 'SENSATIONALIZED AND IN MANY PARTS INACCURATE.'

"BARELY 24 HOURS AFTER SECRETARY KISSINGER URGED LATIN  
AMERICAN LEADERS TO PUT ASIDE 'SLOGANS' AND 'RHETORIC' IN  
DEALING WITH THE U.S., HE FOUND HIMSELF IN AN OLD STYLE  
NORTH-SOUTH DIALOGUE WITH A GROUP OF HOSTILE QUESTIONERS.

"JOURNALISTS REPRESENTING THE STATE-CONTROLLED PERUVIAN  
PRESS DOMINATED A NEWS CONFERENCE HERE, CHALLENGING  
KISSINGER ON A SERIES OF CHARGES: CIA 'INTERFERENCE IN  
THE AFFAIRS OF OTHER NATIONS,' SUCH AS CHILE; ALLEGEDLY  
REPRESSIVE U.S. ECONOMIC MEASURES AGAINST THE LEFTIST  
GOVERNMENT HERE; ALLEGED U.S. INTERVENTION ON THE SIDE OF  
SOUTH AFRICA IN THE ANGOLAN CIVIL WAR.

"ODDLY ENOUGH, PERU IS ONE NATION ON KISSINGER'S CURRENT  
LATIN TOUR WITH WHICH THE U.S. HAS A CHANGING AND POSSIBLY  
IMPROVING POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC RELATIONSHIP. . . .

"... KISSINGER TOOK MOST OF THE INQUISITION IN STRIDE AND  
AT NO TIME LET HIMSELF BE NETTLED AS HE HAS BY SIMILAR  
QUESTIONS AIMED AT HIM IN WASHINGTON. BUT, AS HE OFTEN  
DOES IN WASHINGTON, HE ARTFULLY AVOIDED MOST OF THE HARD  
ISSUES, SETTING THE RECORD STRAIGHT ON SOME OF THE MORE  
PROPAGANDISTIC POINTS AND REFUSING TO CONCEDE ANYTHING.

"THUS, HE DISCUSSED THE CIA BY NOTING THAT THE SENATE  
INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEE ABSOLVED IT OF OVERTHROWING THE  
ALLENDE GOVERNMENT IN CHILE. HE DISCUSSED ANGOLA BY DIS-  
COURSING AT LENGTH ABOUT THE CUBAN ARMED INTERVENTION  
THERE AND IGNORING THE SOUTH AFRICANS. HE DENIED THERE  
WAS ANY U.S. TRADE EMBARGO AGAINST PERU AND NOTED THAT  
ABOUT DOLLAR 70 MILLION IN MILITARY EQUIPMENT HAD BEEN  
SOLD TO THE GOVERNMENT HERE IN THE PAST 18 MONTHS."

SECRETARY KISSINGER HAS WRITTEN OFF ANGOLA AS LOST TO THE CUBAN INTERVENTION FORCE BUT THE ADMINISTRATION ALMOST CERTAINLY WILL APPROACH CONGRESS FOR A CONSIDERABLE INCREASE OF ARMS AID TO OTHER AFRICAN COUNTRIES, ESPECIALLY ZAIRE AND ZAMBIA. . . A SENIOR U.S. OFFICIAL DISCLOSED, WHO IS ALWAYS PRESENT ON KISSINGER'S PLANE DURING OVERSEAS TRIPS. . .

"THE OFFICIAL MADE CLEAR KISSINGER WAS ONLY MAKING A DIPLOMATIC GESTURE WHEN HE RECENTLY TOLD THE SENATE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE THE ADMINISTRATION WAS CONSIDERING A REQUEST . . . FOR OVERT AID TO (PRO-U.S.) ANGOLAN FORCES . . .

"HE SAID THE BLOODY ANGOLAN CIVIL WAR IS NOT OVER YET BUT IT WILL BE SOON. . .

"CUBA'S INTERVENTION IN ANGOLA WAS ONE OF THE TOP SUBJECTS KISSINGER DISCUSSED WITH PRESIDENT BERMUDEZ, . . . PARTICULARLY AS THE LIMITARY MILITARY REGIME IS AMONG HAVANA'S BETTER FRIENDS. . .

". . . FLYING INTO LIMA, . . . THE SENIOR OFFICIAL LISTED 'A LOT OF BILATERAL PROBLEMS': . . . PERU'S NATIONALIZATION OF AMERICAN PROPERTY, IT'S PRO-CUBA ATTITUDE, AND CLAIMS -- THOUGH DENIED BY PERU -- OF SOVIET ADVISERS ON PERUVIAN SOIL.

"THE OFFICIAL . . . ADDED: 'KISSINGER IS ANXIOUS TO SEE IF MORALES BERMUDEZ AND OTHER LEADERS MIGHT BE CHANGING THEIR MINDS IN LIGHT OF THE ANGOLAN SITUATION.' CUBA . . . IN AFRICA CAUSED VENEZUELA TO RECONSIDER ITS SUPPORT OF HAVANA, THE OFFICIAL SAID.

"HE POINTED OUT VENEZUELA HAD STOPPED SHIPMENT OF AVIATION FUEL TO GUYANA BECAUSE (IT) HAD ALLOWED CUBA TO SET UP A REFUELLING SYSTEM . . . FOR . . . ANGOLA. THE SENIOR OFFICIAL REVEALED KISSINGER LAST WEEK SPOKE TO GUYANA'S FOREIGN MINISTER ABOUT THIS . . .

"AT A PRESS CONFERENCE, . . . KISSINGER DENIED THE U.S. IS REFUSING TO SELL ARMS AND IS IMPOSING ECONOMIC SANCTIONS AGAINST PERU. . .

". . . THE SENIOR OFFICIAL SAID KISSINGER IS NOT DISTURBED THAT HIS MEETING NEXT WEEK IN SAN JOSE WILL BE WITH THE CENTRAL AMERICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS INSTEAD OF THE PRESIDENTS. . .

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"OTHER DEVELOPMENTS: KISSINGER WILL ADD URUGUAY, AS WELL AS ARGENTINA, IF HE ATTENDS OAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY JUNE 1 IN SANTIAGO. . . THE SENIOR OFFICIAL DISCLOSED KISSINGER WILL MEET ALL AMERICAN AMBASSADORS TO THE M.E. THE WEEK AFTER HE RETURNS. . . TO PLAN U.S. STRATEGY FOR A NEW PEACE EFFORT. . . KISSINGER INTENDS TO VISIT AFRICA IN THE FIRST WEEK OF APRIL. . . KISSINGER DOES NOT EXPECT THE SOVIET UNION TO REPLY TO THE LATEST PROPOSALS FOR A SALT TREATY UNTIL THE SECOND WEEK OF MARCH. . ."

WIRES

1. AP (FREED FROM LIMA): KISSINGER MOVES ON TO BRAZIL TODAY AFTER WARNING PERU'S LEFTIST MILITARY REGIME THAT JOINING THE NO-ALIGNED BLOC OF NATIONS ROB IT OF FLEXIBILITY IN FOREIGN POLICY.

'TOO OFTEN,' KISSINGER SAID WED. NIGHT IN A BANQUET TOAST, 'NATIONS WHICH CHOSE NON-ALIGNMENT TO SHIELD THEMSELVES FROM THE PRESSURES OF POWERFUL GLOBAL BLOCS HAVE TENDED TO FORM A RIGID, IDEOLOGICAL, CONFRONTATIONIST BLOC OF THEIR OWN...'

'THE VARIETY OF THE WORLD'S NATIONS IS TOO GREAT AND OUR COMMON PROBLEMS TOO URGENT FOR SUCH OUTMODED PRACTICES. THEY ONLY DEEPEN OUR DIVISIONS AND IMPAIR OUR MUTUAL PROGRESS ...'

'WE MUST RESPECT EACH OTHER'S SERIOUSNESS ... IT IS UP TO US TO TRANSLATE OUR PEOPLE'S IDEALS INTO CONCRETE ACHIEVEMENTS THROUGH NEGOTIATION, NOT CONFRONTATION; THROUGH COMMON EFFORT, NOT DISCORD.'

... THE BRAZILIAN MILITARY REGIME EXPECTS THE VISIT TO BOOST IT FROM THE STATUS OF 'AN ALMOST AUTOMATIC PARTNER' OF THE UNITED STATES TO THAT OF 'AN ALLY, IN THE POLITICAL SENSE OF THE WORD,; A SPOKESMAN FOR THE FOREIGN MINISTRY TOLD NEWSMEN IN BRASILIA.

2. UPI (WALTE FROM LIMA): ROCK-THROWING DEMONSTRATORS SMASHED WINDOWS IN THE U.S. EMBASSY IN LIMA LATE WED. NIGHT IN A PROTEST AGAINST THE VISIT OF KISSINGER.

KISSINGER, PRAISING THE SPIRIT OF COOPERATION SHOWN BY PERU'S MILITARY LEADERS DURING HIS VISIT, LEFT FOR BRAZIL AS U.S. EMBASSY OFFICIALS ASSESSED THE DAMAGE FROM THE ATTACK.

WHILE KISSINGER WAS BEING TOASTED AT A BANQUET AT THE PERUVIAN FOREIGN MINISTRY WED. NIGHT, ABOUT 30 DEMONSTRATORS HURLED ROCKS AT THE EMBASSY IN A SUDDEN ATTACK, SMASHING ABOUT EIGHT GLASS WINDOWS.

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EMBASSY SECURITY GUARDS FIRED SHOTS INTO THE AIR AND LOCAL POLICE STATIONED IN THE HEAVILY GUARDED DOWNTOWN AREA NEAR THE EMBASSY RUSHED TO THE SCENE, BREAKING UP THE DISTURBANCE AND MAKING A NUMBER OF ARRESTS.

THE ROCK-THROWING INCIDENT WAS THE FIRST INCIDENT DURING THE KISSINGER VISIT. THE ATTACK TOOK PLACE DESPITE A HEAVY DISPLAY OF POLICE.

MINUTES BEFORE KISSINGER'S JET TOOK OFF FOR BRAZIL, KISSINGER TOLD LOCAL NEWSMEN THAT FROM NOW ON, 'PERU AND THE U.S. WILL DEAL WITH EACH OTHER ON A BASIS OF EQUALITY AND RESPECT.'

FOREIGN MINISTER DE LA FLOR SAID THE VISIT 'STRENGTHENED THE RELATIONS OF THE U.S. WITH PERU BY INFORMING KISSINGER OF THE PERUVIAN REVOLUTION OF THE ARMED FORCES.'

KISSINGER, DURING PRIVATE MEETINGS WITH THE RULING GENERALS OF PERU, ASSURED THEM OF WASHINGTON'S UNDERSTANDING OF THEIR INDEPENDENT FOREIGN POLICY AND PROFOUND DOMESTIC SOCIAL CHANGES.

THE SECRETARY SAID THE U.S. CAN WORK WITH PERU'S LEFTIST MILITARY GOVERNMENT WITHOUT ALWAYS AGREEING WITH ITS OUTSPOKEN POSITIONS AS A NONALIGNED, THIRD WORLD NATION.

THE REFORM-MINDED GOVERNMENT'S NATIONALIZATION OF LARGE U.S. PROPERTIES HAS STRAINED U.S.-PERUVIAN RELATIONS, BUT KISSINGER'S CORDIAL RECEPTION BY GOVT. LEADERS REFLECTED AN IMPROVED ATMOSPHERE.

#### RADIO/TV

1. ABC (DUNSMORE) FROM LIMA, "GOOD MORNING AMERICA" -- "KISSINGER'S LATIN AMERICAN TOUR HAS A NUMBER OF THEMES. ONE OF THEM IS CUBA. WHILE HE CONSIDERS IT TACTICALLY WRONG TO APPEAR TO BE CONDUCTING AN ANTI-CASTRO CRUSADE, HE EAGERLY AWAITS HIS HOSTS TO BRING UP THE SUBJECT, AT WHICH TIME KISSINGER DELIVERS HIS SET LINE ON CUBA. THAT LINE IS THAT CUBAN MILITARY SUCCESSES IN ANGOLA COULD HAVE FAR-REACHING IMPLICATIONS, ESPECIALLY IN LATIN AMERICA, AND THAT FOR ITS PART THE U.S. WILL NOT TOLERATE ANOTHER CUBAN ANGOLA-TYPE EFFORT.

"HOWEVER, CUBA IS BY NO MEANS THE ONLY, OR EVEN THE MAIN, SUBJECT IN THE KISSINGER TALKS WITH SOUTH AMERICAN LEADERS. AS HIS MAJOR SPEECH IN CARACAS INDICATED, KISSINGER IS BEING FRANK ABOUT MISTAKES HE BELIEVES THE U.S. HAS MADE IN ITS PAST RELATIONS WITH THE AREA. AT THE SAME TIME, HE IS BLUNT ABOUT WHAT HE THINKS ARE ERRORS IN LATIN AMERICAN PERCEPTIONS ABOUT THE U.S. DEBATES ABOUT WHETHER THE U.S. IS BEING PATRONIZING OR DOMINATING ARE NONPRODUCTIVE, IS HIS MESSAGE. THIS

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MESSAGE WILL OF COURSE BE RECEIVED WITH VARYING DEGREES OF ACCEPTANCE OR HOSTILITY. BUT IT IS REFRESHINGLY DIFFERENT FROM THE GRANDIOSE PROMISES OF THE PAST ON WHICH THERE WERE FEW DELIVERIES.

"ONE OTHER DIFFERENCE IN THE TOUR. IN THE PAST THE U.S. HAS TAKEN FLAK FOR SUPPORTING RIGHT-WING DICTATORSHIPS ON THE CONTINENT. BY VISITING PERU, KISSINGER IS BREAKING FROM THAT APPARENT TENDENCY. PERU IS A LEFT-WING DICTATORSHIP."

ANCHORMAN STEVE BELL MENTIONS THAT SECRETARY TRAVELING TO BRAZIL THURSDAY. ALSO SAYS THAT IN THE EARLY PLANNING OF DR. KISSINGER'S TRIP, CHILE WAS TO BE ONE OF THE STOPS. "BUT, UNDER CONGRESSIONAL PRESSURE, SECRETARY KISSINGER EVENTUALLY CHANGED HIS PLANS."

2. NBC (VALERIANI) FROM LIMA, "TODAY SHOW" -- ANCHORMAN LEW WOOD REPORTS THAT PERU VISIT CONCLUDING. VALERIANI, "KISSINGER WAS GREETED AT THE AIRPORT BY PERU'S FOREIGN MINISTER, GEN. MIGUEL ANGEL DE LA FLOR. DESPITE HIS REPUTATION FOR FIERY RHETORIC DIRECTED AT COUNTRIES LIKE THE UNITED STATES, DE LA FLOR WAS THE FIRST

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LATIN FOREIGN MINISTER TO INVITE KISSINGER TO VISIT, AND THE TWO MEN HAVE WORKED HARMONIOUSLY AT HEMISPHERIC MEETINGS. PERU IS RUN BY A MILITARY REGIME, WHICH TURNED OUT AN HONOR GUARD OF RANGERS FOR THE WELCOMING CEREMONY. THE REGIME IS AGGRESSIVELY LEFT-WING. BUT KISSINGER QUICKLY MADE CLEAR THAT'S NO LONGER A PROBLEM FOR WASHINGTON.

SECRETARY: EVEN WHEN WE DID NOT ALWAYS AGREE, WE DEALT WITH EACH OTHER WITH RESPECT, AND WITH THE CONVICTION THAT ON THE BASIS OF DIGNITY AND EQUALITY, WE CAN WORK TOGETHER TO IMPROVE THE CONDITIONS OF OUR PEOPLE AND THE CONDITIONS OF MANKIND.

VALERIANI, "LATER TODAY, KISSINGER IS FLYING TO BRAZIL, WHICH IS ALSO RUN BY A MILITARY GOVERNMENT, A RIGHT-WING MILITARY GOVERNMENT. HIS TRAVELS UNDERLINE THE CURRENT U.S. POLICY OF DEALING WITH LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRIES AS THEY ARE, AND NOT AS WASHINGTON WOULD LIKE THEM TO BE."
