THE ISRAELI STATE RADIO SAID ISRAEL HAS ACCEPTED A FIVE-POINT PLAN WORKED OUT THROUGH THE UNITED STATES FOR A SETTLEMENT WITH EGYPT.

THE RADIO QUOTED GOVERNMENT SOURCES IN DESCRIBING THE PLAN, REACHED IN TALKS BETWEEN SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER AND HIS AIDES IN EGYPT AND ISRAEL.

IT SAID THE POINTS WERE:

- A PRISONER OF WAR EXCHANGE "AS SOON AS POSSIBLE."
- A SUPPLY CORRIDOR FOR THE ENCIRCLED EGYPTIAN 3RD ARMY THAT WOULD BE U.N.-SUPERVISED AND RUN THROUGH ISRAELI LINES. BUT IT WOULD INCLUDE NO WEAPONS, AND NO WAY BE CONTROLLED BY EGYPT.
- REMOVAL OF THE EGYPTIAN BLOCKADE OF THE BAB-EL-MANDEB STRAIT, ISRAEL'S VITAL OUTLET TO THE INDIAN OCEAN.
- NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN ISRAELI AND EGYPTIAN MILITARY COMMANDERS TO ARRANGE A MORE CONVENIENT CEASE-FIRE LINE FOR THE TWO SIDES.
- DIRECT PEACE NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN ISRAEL AND EGYPT, ONCE THE FIRST FOUR POINTS ARE FULFILLED.
