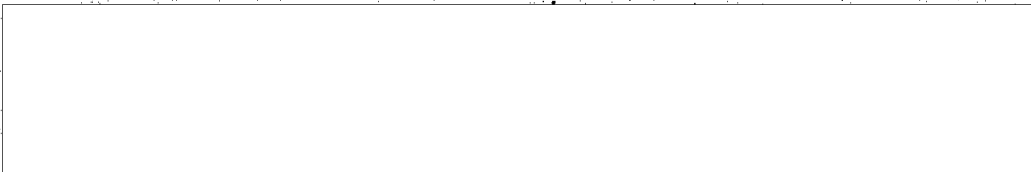


Dear General Haig:
