THE WASHINGTON POST

JACK FULLER NOTES THAT THE CAMPAIGN CONTROVERSY OVER WHETHER OR NOT THE PRESIDENT MISSED AN OPPORTUNITY IN 1969 TO END THE WAR WAS ENLARGED BY THE ADDITION OF SENATOR MCGOVERN TO THE FRAY. (A-1)

CARL ROBINSON OBSERVES FROM SAIGON THAT A VIETNAMESE PRIEST WHO WAS A PRISONER IN HANOI SAID THE NORTH VIETNAMESE INTEND TO USE U.S. PRISONERS TO BARGAIN FOR THE REBUILDING OF THEIR COUNTRY, AND THAT THEY ARE NOT INTERESTED IN A PRISONER EXCHANGE. (A-1)

RAMSEY CLARK CLAIMS THAT HE WAS ASSURED BY HIGH HANOI OFFICIALS THAT AMERICAN POWS WILL BE RELEASED WHEN THE BOMBING STOPS AND THE U.S. WITHDRAWS FROM VIETNAM. (A-1)
