THE MOST, TIMES, AND SUN ALL HEADLINE YESTERDAY'S COMMUNIQUE ON A JOINT ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF NORTH VIETNAM.

THE WASHINGTON POST

MURREY MARDER REPORTS THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE U.S.-NORTH VIETNAM JOINT ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF NORTH
VIETNAM. THE WASHINGTON-HANOI EDD-WORD COMMUNIQUE ISSUED USED
EXTREMELY CORDIAL LANGUAGE FOR TWO NATIONS THAT SIGNED A CEASEFIRE ON JANUARY 27. ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS ACKNOWLEDGED A
POSSIBLE STRUGGLE WITH CONGRESS OVER PROJECTED BILLIONS OF
DOLLARS IN POSTWAR AID FOR INDOCHINA. THE COMMUNIQUE ITSELF
STATED THAT YOU AND VARIOUS NORTH VIETNAMESE OFFICIALS "DISCHSSED WARDONS IMPERATIVE MEASURES" TO "IMPROVE AND EXPEDITE"
CARRYING OUT THE CEASE-FIRE. AT THE WHITE HOUSE, ZIEGLER
EXPLAINED IN PART THE URGENT CALL IN THE COMMUNIQUE FOR "FULL
AND SCRUPHULOUS IMPLEMENTATION" OF THE HARIS AGREEMENT. HE
SAPD THE "U.S. CONSIDERS AN EARLY CEASE-FIRE IN LACS A MATTER
OF GREAT URGENCY, AND WE EXPECT SUCH A CEASE-FIRE TO TAKE
EFFECT IN A MATTER OF DAYS." HE MADE NO MENTION OF CAMBODIA.
ZIEGLER ADDED THAT NO "DOLLAR FIGURES" WERE DISCUSSED BY YOU
IN HANOI. AND THAT THE AMERICAN MEMBERS OF THE JOINT ECONOMIC
COMMISSION WILL BE NOMINATED WITHIN TWO WEEKS AND SAPD YOU
INDICATED THAT THE GROUP "SHOULD BE ORGANIZED IN ABOUT A
MONTH." (A-1)

CONGRESSMAN H. R. GROSS IMMEDIATELY LABELED THE WASHINGTON-HANDI COMMISSION "THE CONDUIT FOR THE HANDOUT." GROSS SAID OF CONGRESS: "WE PROBABLY WON'T HAVE ANYTHING TO SAY ABOUT SETTING UP A CONDUIT. BUT WE'LL HAVE A WHOLE LOT TO SAY ABOUT WHAT GOES INTO IT. I'M OPPOSED TO FAYING THEM ANYTHING."

ZIEGLER ALSO NOTED YOUR STOP IN TOKYO OFTER PEKING AND THAT YOU PLAN TO HOLD A PRESS CONFERENCE AFTER YOUR RETURN. (A-1)

PRESIDENT NIXON, FACED WITH AN UPROAR FROM CONGRESS AND SOME VETERANS GROUPS, YESTERDAY ORDERED THE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION TO WITHERAW ITS PLAN TO SAVE \$160 MILLION BY CUITING BENEFITS FOR DISABLED VIETNAM GIS. (A-1)

THE DEVALUED U.S. DOLLAR WAS HIT BY A WAVE OF SELLING IN REOPENED FOREIGN MONEY MARKETS YESTERDAY, BUT IT HELD UP BETTER
THAN EXPECTED IN MOST EXCHANGES. IN LONDON AND ZURICH, GOLD
WENT UP TO \$72.13 AN OUNCE FROM THE FORMER RECORD OF \$70 AN
OUNCE, SET LAST AUGUST. THE OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT DEALING PRICE
OF GOLD IS \$42.22. UP FROM \$38. MONEY MARKETS CONTINUE TO BE
NERVOUS AND IT IS STILL UNCERTAIN WHETHER OR NOT THE DEVALUATION OF THE DOLLAR WILL BRING A HALT TO THE INTERNATIONAL
MONETARY CRISIS. (A-1)

THE U.S.-CUBAN ANTIHIJACKING AGREEMENT WILL BE SIGNED IN WASHINGTON AND HAVANA TODAY. U.S. OFFICIALS SAY THE AGREEMENT IS VERY SATISFACTORY AND WILL SERVE AS BOTH A REAL AND A FSYCHOLOGICAL DETERRENT TO HIJACKING. HOWEVER, THE AGREEMENT DOES NOT AFFECT THE TRADITIONAL AMERICAN POSITION CONCERNSING ACCEPTANCE OF REFUGEES FROM CUBA. (A-3)

A POST EDITORIAL SEES RECONSTRUCTION ADD TO NORTH VIETNAM
BECOMING THE MOST TORTURED ISSUE IN THE POSTWAR PERIOD. IT
ALSO NOTES THE APPARENT GOOD PHYSICAL CONDITION OF RETURNING
U.S. POWS AS BRINGING TO THE NORTH VIETNAMESE A POLITICALLY
USEFUL MEASURE OF GOOD WILL. THE JOYFUL RETURN OF THESE MEN
IS CONTRASTED AGAINST THE GRIM AND GAUNT COMMUNIST PRISONERS
RELEASED BY SAIGON. NOTING THAT THE SAME GENERAL ATTITUDE
WHICH LED TO A DISPROPORTIONATE NUMBER OF POOF. LESS EDUCATED AND BLACK AMERICANS TO BE SENT TO FIGHT AND DIE IN
VIETNAM IS AFFECTING THE SURVIVORS AT HOME. THE POST NOTES
THE INCREDIBLE PROPOSAL TO REDUCE FEDERAL BENEFITS FOR VIETNAM AMPUTEES. THE ISSUE OF AMNESTY IS ALSO TOUCHED UPON.
THE EDITORIAL NOTES THAT THE POST INTENDS TO ELABORATE ITS
OWN VIEW ON THIS ISSUE ON ANOTHER OCCASION.

EDWIN REISCHAUER WRITES OF THE TWO VIETNAM PACTS. ONE IS THE WITHDRAWAL OF AMERICAN FORCES AND THE RETURN OF POWS. BOTH WITHIN 60 DAYS. DURING WHICH TIME THE FOUR PARTIES INVOLVED WILL DESERVE ACCESSETIES IN PLACE. THE OTHER AGREEMENT IS THE SETTING UP BY THE TWO "SOUTH VIETNAMESE PARTIES" OF A NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND GONCORD. IN EFFECT. THE PEACEFUL REUNIFICATION OF SOUTH VIETNAM. HE SEES ONE ENDANGERING THE OTHER BY ASKING THE CRUCIAL QUESTION OF WHETHER WE HAVE ENDANGERED THE WISE AND ESSENTIAL FIRST AGREEMENT BY WRAPPING IT UP WITH THE UNREALS ISTIC SECOND ONE. (A-26)

BEANARD GREETZMAN REVIEWS YESTERDAY'S JOINT COMMUNIQUE. HE NOTES THAT WITH CONGRESS IN RECESS THIS WEEK, THERE WAS LITTLE REACTION TO THE COMMUNIQUE. HOWEVER, REPRESENTATIVE H. R. GROSS SAID: "I'M OPPOSED TO PAYING THEM ANYTHING." (A=1)

PLACING THE BLAME DIRECTLY ON THE UNITED STATES AND PLEADING IGNORANCE OF PREDEVALUATION CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN HIS FINANCE MINISTER AND THE CHIEF AMERICAN NEGOTIATOR. (A-1)

FLORA LEWIS CONTENDS THAT THE RECONSTRUCTION AID TO NORTH VIETNAM WILL BE A TOOL WITH WHICH THE UNITED STATES HOPES TO WEDGE THE NORTH INTO A POSITION OF DESIRING TO MAINTAIN PEACE LONG AFTER THE LAST AMERICAN SOLDIER AND POW HAVE GONE HOME.
