SCHLESINGER BAYS 5 DEAD, 16 MISSING, 78-88 HOUNDED IN MAYAGUEZ OPERATION

"ISSUES AND ANSHERS"

SECRETARY SCHLESINGER SAID SUNDAY THAT THREE MARINES AND THO AIRMEN WERE KILLED IN THE MAYAGUEZ OPERATION, 16 WERE REPORTED MISSING AND 78 OR SO INJURED. THIS WAS NOT THE FINAL TALLY, HE SAID, BECAUSE OF DIFFICULTIES IN LOCATING THE SURVIVORS.

PREVIOUS ESTIMATES HAD REPORTED ONE DEAD, 13 MISSING AND RR HOUNDED, SCHLESINGER SAID MANY OF THE WOUNDED HERE SUFFERING ONLY SLIGHT INJURIES.

THE SECRETARY SAID A FOURTH BOMBING RAID AGAINST MAINLAND CAMBODIAN TARGETS HAD BEEN PLANNED, THEN SCRAPPED AFTER THE CREW WAS RELEASED, EARLIER PENTAGON REPORTS HAD SAID THERE WERE ONLY THO SUCH RAIDS.

SCHLESINGER CALLED THE AIR STRIKES "A VERY PRUDENT, LIMITED USE OF FORCE," THE MOTIVATION, HE SAID, "GLEARLY WAS TO PROTECT THE MARINES ON THE ISLAND."

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HE DECLINED TO SAY WHAT ACTION THE UNITED STATSES MIGHT TAKE IF SOUTH KOREA HERE ATTACKED, ALTHOUGH HE NOTED THE U.S. IS BOUND BY TREATY TO SECUL. "THE HEART OF DETERENCE IS TO MAINTAIN UNCERTAINTY ABOUT SPECIFIC ACTION WHILE MAINTAINING CERTAINTY ABOUT OUR COMMITMENTS," HE SAID. -- AP; UPI; ABC; NBC (5/18/75)

MARINES INVADED WRONG ISLAND, CAPTAIN SAYS

U.S. MARINES INVADED THE WRONG CAMBODIAN ISLAND TRYING TO RESCUE THE MAYAGUEZ CREW, THE CAPTAIN AND CREW MEMBERS SAID SUNDAY. "THEY PROBABLY WFRE UNAWARE WE HAD LEFT THE ISLAND," SAID CAPT. CHARLES MILLER. "I GUFSS THE MARINES FROM THE DESTROYER ESCORTS WERE NOT INFORMED. THEY WERE COMING FROM SUBIC IN THE PHILIPPINES, AND THE SURVEILLANCE PLANES WERE FROM SOMEPLACE ELSE."

THAILAND DEMANDS U.S. APOLOGY

THAILAND'S FOREIGN MINISTER, CHATICHAI CHOONHAVAN HAS DEMANDED AN OFFICIAL AMERICAN APOLOGY BY Z A.M. (EDT) TUESDAY FOR LAUNCHING THE "MAYAGUEZ" RESCUE MISSION FOR THAILAND. THAI STUDENTS ENDED AN ALL-NIGHT VIGIL AT THE U.S. EMBASSY IN BANGKOK TODAY BY BURNING EFFIGIES OF SECRETARY OF STATE KISSINGER AND "UNCLE SAM."

KISSINGER ARRIVES IN VIENNA


HENRY KISSINGER ARRIVED IN VIENNA SUNDAY, LAYING PLANS FOR

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TALKS WITH SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER ANDREI A. GROMYKO TO REWIN HIS REPUTATION AS A SUPER SECRETARY OF STATE.

KISSINGER WILL TRY TO ARRANGE A NEW NUCLEAR ARMS LIMITATION TREATY TO BE SIGNED IN THE FALL BY PRESIDENT FORD AND SOVIET PARTY LEADER LEONID I. BREZHNEV. THE TRIP WAS DESIGNED IN PART TO REASSURE WESTERN ALLIES OF U.S. RESOLVE AND TO LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR FORDIS OWN EUROPEAN TRIP LATER THIS MONTH.

ON THIS TRIP THE JOKES FLOWED. (UPI) WHEN, SOMEWHERE OVER THE ATLANTIC, A MEMSMAN ASKED ABOUT KISSINGER'S CLOUT IN DIPLOMACY, THE SENIOR AMERICAN OFFICIAL GRINNED LIKE A PUSSY CAT AND SAID, "WHAT THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF THE UNITED STATES SAYS MEANS SOMETHING -- DITSIDE OF WASHINGTON, ANYWAY."

THERE CAME EVEN A HA-HA MENTION OF KISSINGER ONCE HAVING USED AUSTRIAN SOIL -- IN SALZBURG, WITH PRESIDENT NIXON, LAST YEAR -- TO THREATEN TO RESIGN. THE FACT KISSINGER DID NOT RESIGN -- BUT ENDURED WATERGATE, THE COMING OF FORD AND THE GOING OF INDOCHINA -- LED TO THIS TRIP TO VIENNA.

THE MSENIOR AMERICAN OFFICIALM EXPECTS NO BREAKTHROUGH ON THE SALT IN KISSINGER'S MFETING WITH GROMYKO, BUT THE GAME PLAN CALLS FOR CHECKING SIGNALS WITH GROMYKO, HE SAID. AP, UPI (5/18/75)

U.S. WOULD STRIKE MARDER AT NORTH KOREA NOW, KISSINGER SAYS

SECRETARY KISSINGER SAID THE U.S. WOULD STRIKE BACK HARDER IN KOREA THAN IT DID IN MUCH OF THE VIETNAM WAR IF SOUTH KORFA WERE INVADED NOW. IN A U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT INTERVIEW, KISSINGER SAID HE DOUBTS THE U.S. WOULD FEEL THE SAME CONSTRAINTS TO AVOID HEAVY BOMRING AND BLOCKADES THAT WE FELT IN VIETNAM HOMBC (5/18/75)

MANSFIELD CALLS FOR RECOGNITION OF INDOCHINA COMMUNISTS "FACE THE NATION"

SENATE MAJORITY LEADER MIKE MANSFIELD CALLED SUNDAY FOR DIPLOMATIC RECOGNITION OF THE NEW COMMUNIST GOVERNMENTS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA TO AVOID REPETITION OF THE MAYAGUEZ CRISIS AND ITS RESOLUTION BY MILITARY FORCE. MANSFIELD BLAMED THE NEFD FOR MILITARY ACTION ON THE LACK OF DIPLOMATIC CONTACT WITH THE NEW KHMER ROUGE GOVERNMENT, HE ALSO RECOMMENDED A FULL REEVALUATION OF AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY. THE UNITED STATES SHOULD FXERCISE "GREAT CAUTION" IN GIVING AID TO OTHER NATIONS BECAUSE \$150 BILLION HAS BEEN WASTED ON AID SINCE 1945, HE ADDED.

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MANSFIELD WAS MILDLY CRITICAL OF PRESIDENT FORD FOR DNLY BRIEFING -- RATHER THAN CONSULTING -- CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS ABOUT U.S. STRATEGIEW FOR REGAINING THE MAYAGUEZ AND ITS CREWMEN. HE SAID HE WAS NOT UPSET "PERSONALLY" ABOUT FORD'S LACK OF CONSULTATION WITH CONGRESS BEFORE ORDERING MILITARY ACTION TO SEIZE THE MAYAGUEZ, BUT "THE PRINCIPAL IS A GOOD ONE THAT THERE OUGHT TO BE MORE CONSULTATION BETWEEN THE PRESIDENT AND CONGRESS BEFORE THE USE OF MILITARY FORCE IS AGREED TO."

AND THAT IS WHAT THE WAR POWERS ACT CONTAINS."

THE ODDS FOR PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT IN THE MIDDLE EAST HAVE DROPPED SINCE SECRETARY KISSINGER'S FAILURE AT SHUTTLE DIPLOMACY, MANSFIELD SAID, BUT KISSINGER'S RELATION WITH CONGRESS IS "STILL A VERY GOOD ONE," HE ADDED, UPI/CRS (5/18/75)

JACKSON SAYS PUBLIC TRUST IN FOREIGN POLICY HAS "EVAPORATED"

SEN. HANRY JACKSON SAID SUNDAY THAT PUBLIC TRUST IN FOREIGN POLICY HAS EVAPORATED IN THE WAKE OF OBSESSIVELY SECRET AND PERSONAL DIPLOMACY, HIS REMARKS, WHICH NEVER MENTIONED SECRETARY KISSINGER BY NAME, WERE PREPARED FOR COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES AT SWEET BRIAR COLLEGE HERE, JACKSON SAID THE U.S. MAS SUFFERED MAJOR REVERSES IN FOREIGN POLICY WITH A RESULTING DECLINE IN NATIONAL PRESTIGE AND INFLUENCE IN THE LAST TWO YEARS.

"IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL ORDER WHICH RESTS ON THE SHARING OF POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES," HE SAID, "OPENNESS, CANDOR AND RESPECT FOR THE PUBLIC'S RIGHT TO KNOW ARE ABSOLUTELY ESSENTIALL."

A CREDIBLE WESTERN DEFENSE POSTURE IS VITAL TO THE EFFECTIVENESS OF U.S. FOREIGN POLICY, HE ADDED, AP (5/18/75)

PRAVDA CITES IMPORTANCE OF US-SOVIET RELATIONS

PRAVDA PUBLISHED AN UPBEAT ASSESSMENT OF U.S. +80VIET RELATIONS SUNDAY ON THE EVE OF A MEETING BETWEEN SECRETARY KISSINGER AND SOVIET FORFIGN MINISTER ANDREI GROMYKO. THE REVIEW OF BILATERAL RELATIONS AVOIDED MENTIONING ACROMONIOUS REMARKS IN RECENT SPEECHES BY BOTH KISSINGER AND GROMYKO.

"THE IMPORTANCE OF THESE RELATIONS FOR THE CAUSE OF PEACE CAN HARDLY BE OVER-ESTIMATED," THE COMMUNIST PARTY NEWSPAPER SAID. "BOTH SIDES ARE STRIVING TO ELEVATE THESE RELATIONS TO A NEW PLANE, TO BRING TO LIFE THE UNDERSTANDING ACHIEVED IN VLADIVOSTOK IN NOVEMBER 1974, DURING THE MEETING BETWEEN L. I. BREZHNEV AND G. SADAT SAYS ARABS AGREE ON PEACE TALK STRATEGY

EGYPTAIN PRESIDENT ANWAR SADAT SAID SUNDAY HE AND OTHER ARAB LEADERS HAD REACHED FIDTAL AGREEMENTS ON THE NEXT HOVES TOWARD A MIDDLE EAST PEACE SETTLEMENT. NBC REPORTED THAT PLO LEADER YASSER ARAPAT HAS AT HIS SIDE WHEN HE MADE THE STATEMENT. HE FLEW HOME TO CAIRO FROM TWO DAYS OF TALKS IN DAMASCUS WHERE HE CONFERRED WITH SYRIAN PRESIDENT HAFEZ ASSAD AND ARAFAT, HE ALSO VISITED JURDAN, IRAQ AND KUHATT!

PORTUGUESE PROTESTORS DAMAND EXPULSION OF CARLUCCI

SOLDIERS OF A PORTUGUESE LEFT-WING ARTILLERY UNIT SAID SUNDAY THEY HAVE DISCOVERED A MAJOR COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARY PLOT AND URGED MILITARY UNITS THROUGHOUT PORTUGAL TO JOIN IN A MANHUNT FOR THE MEN IMPLICATED IN IT. A STATEMENT BY THE MILITARY SECURITY FORCES SAID MORE THAN 20 SOLDIERS AND CIVILIANS HAVE ALREADY BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE PLOT.

THE AMMOUNCEMENT CAME AFTER DEMONSTRATORS SHOUTING ANTI-AMERICAN SLUGANS PAINTED RED SWASTIKAS ON THE U.S. EMBASSY IN LISBON' ABOUT 150 LEFT-WINE YOUTHS MARCHED ON THE U.S. EMBASSY, CALLING FOR THE ARREST AND EXPULSION OF AMBASSADOR PRANK_CARLUCCI AND AN UNIDENTIFIED CIA AGENT. AP. UPT (5/18/75)

PENTAGON'S PROFESSOR SHOWS HIS STYLE BY NICK THIMMESON (EXCERPTED FROM THE CHICAGO TRIBUNE)

FOR SECRETARY SCHLESINGER, WHO HAS SPENT MORE TIME DEFENDING THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT'S BASIC RIGHT TO EXIST THAN HE HAS IN THE CHORE HE PREFERS -- CORRECTING ITS INTERNAL PROBLEMS -- THE MAYAGUEZ EPISODE HAS A DESPERATELY NEEDED TONIC. "GULLIVER IS RISING, I RELIEVE , " HE TOLD HE FRIDAY, ALLUDING TO THE HERO BOUND BY THE TINY LILLIPUTIONS. "HE MAY NOW FEEL JUSTIFIED IN NOT LYING FLAT ON HIS BACK. EVEN IF THERE ARE NO BONDS ON HIM."

"THE AMERICAN SPIRIT NEEDS STIRRING," HE SAID. "THE LEADER" SHIP GROUPS IN THIS COUNTRY SEEM TO THINK THAT THE WEST HAS NO RIGHT TO DEFEND ITSELF. THAT THE USE OF FORCE IS NOT MORAL. I SPEND TOO MUCH OF MY TIME DEFENDING THE CORPUS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE."

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SCHLESTNGER IS NOT THE SORT OF PERSON WHO EXUDES CHARM. OR HINS PRIEMDS READILY. HE IS A LONER AND INDIVIDUALIST. AT 44, HE WAS THE YOUNGEST MAN TO TAKE OVER THE PENTAGON, AND IS THE FIRST DEFENSE SECRETARY IN RECENT HISTORY NOT TO HAVE SERVED IN THE MILITARY.

NEITHER FACT MEANS A DAMN TO HIM. NOR DOES HIS GATHERING:
REPUTATION THAT HE REFUSES TO FIT INTO WASHINGTON'S SOCIAL
MOLO, WON'T COMPLY WITH THE MEDIA'S DEMANDS TO SIMPLIFY AND
COMPRESS COMPLICATED NOTIONS INTO BRIEF QUOTATIONS FOR PRINTED
PAGE OF PRECIOUS BROADCAST TIME, AND HAS DISDATN FOR MUCH OF THE
AMERICAN SO-CALLED INTELLECTUAL COMMUNITY.

AUTHOR RICHARD WHALEN FEELS THERE IS A RIFT RETWEEN SCHLESINGER AND SECRETARY KISSINGER BASED ON THE TWO MEN'S CHARACTERS.

"JIM SCHLESINGER IS MORE OF AN IDEALIST THAN KISSINGER IS," WHALEN SAID.

"THERE IS RESPECT FOR KISSINGER ON SCHLESINGER'S SIDE BECAUSE HE IS A GENTLEMAN. THERE IS OPENNESS, INTELLECTUAL RESPECT AND NO ENVY WHATSDEVER. I DON'T THINK THAT KISSINGER FOR HIS PART, RECIPROCATES THIS GENTLEMANLY, OPEN RELATIONSHIP, KISSINGER IS MUCH MORE A KNIFE-WIELDER AND A BACKBITER."

SCHLESSINGER IS ADMIRED BUT REMAINS A CONSTANT PUZZLEMENT TO JOE LAITIN, A SEASONED GOVERNMENT INFORMATION MAN WHO BEFRIENDED HIM AT THE BUREAU OF BUDGET. "STRIP THRU THAT LAYER OF JIM'S INTELLECTUAL ARROGANCE, AND DO YOU KNOW WHAT YOU'LL FIND? ANDTHER LAYER OF INTELLECTUAL ARROGANCE. I SAY THAT, KNOWING THAT HE'S ONE OF THE BEST AND NICEST MEN I'VE MET IN THE GOVERNMENT, " LAITIN SAID. (05/18/75)

RICHARDSON OPPOSES US ISOLATIONISM

ELLIOT RICHARDSON, US AMBASSADOR TO BRITAIN, SPOKE OUT TODAY AGAINST ANY AMERICAN WITHDRAWAL FROM WORLD AFFAIR AND SAID THE UNITED STATES "CANNOT LIVE IN SPLENDID ISOLATION."

RICHARDSON TOLA A CONVENTION OF SCOTTISH LAYMERS THAT COMMUNIST TAKEDVERS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA HAD PROMPTED SOME TALK IN AMERICA OF A PETURN TO ISOLATIONISM. "IT SEEMS TO ME THAT SUCK TALK IGNORS THE REALITY OF INTER DEPENDENCE AMONG THE NATIONS OF THE WORLD," HE SAID, HE CITED AS EXAMPLES THE PRECARIOUS NUCLEAR BALANCE BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND THE SOVIET UNION. THAILAND'S PRIME MINISTER KUKRIT PRAMOJ HAS CALLED HIS AMBASSADOR HOME, WHICH MAY PROVIDE A CHANCE FOR A REAL RESTUDY OF AMERICA'S NEW RELATIONS WITH THAILAND.

THE SHORT-RANGE CONVENIENCE OF AMERICAN BASES IN THAILAND CANNOT BE DENIED, AND THE NEW GOVERNMENT MIGHT YET PROVE AMENDABLE. BUT IT WOULD INHERENTLY RISK GIVING THAILAND THE APPEARANCE OF AN AMERICAN BULWARK. THAT WOULD ERASE THAILAND'S POTENTIAL AS A BUFFER AND MIGHT GRANT HER GROWING LOCAL COMMUNIST INSURGENCY A PATRIOTIC APPEAL IT NEED NOT BE GIVEN.

THAILAND'S FRAGILE COALITION GOVERNMENT FACES MANY PROBLEMS IN COPING WITH THE GUERRILLAS, BUT THE GOVERNMENT'S NATURAL ADVANTAGES HOULD SURFLY BE UNDERCUT BY ANY MAJOR AMERICAN MILITARY PRESENCE, WASHINGTON'S PROBLEM, AS IT REVIEWS POLICY TOWARD BANGKOK, WILL BE TO BALANCE THE SHORT-TERM CONVENIENCE OF ITS BASES AGAINST POSSIBLE INJURY TO THAILAND'S BEST HOPES OF KEEPING ITS COMMUNIST INSURGENCY FROM MATURING TO A FULL—SCALE CIVIL WAR. BOSTON HERALD AMERICANI PRESIDENT FORDIS VIGOROUS AND SUCCESSFUL MILITARY RESPONSE TO CAMBODIA! SEIZURE OF AN AMERICAN MERCHANT SHIP ON THE HIGH SEAS WAS ABSOLUTELY ESSENTIAL. MR.
