GANDHI PROHIBITS APPEAL FOR POLITICAL PRISONERS

INDIA'S PRIME MINISTER INDIRA GANDHI FRIDAY STRENGTHENED HER CLAMP DOWN ON POLITICAL OPPONENTS BY DECLARING 900 PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER THE STATE OF EMERGENCY DECREE CANNOT APPEAL TO THE COURTS FOR RELFASE. AN OFFICIAL SPOKESMAN SAID ABOUT ONE THIRD OF THOSE ARRESTED HERE POLITICAL WORKERS AND THE REST HERE "ELEMENTS DETAINED TO PREVENT BREACH OF PEACE."

IN A RADIO ADDRESS FRIDAY NIGHT, MRS. GANDHI APOLOGIZED TO THE NATION FOR STRICT PRESS CENSORSHIP AND SAID THE STATE OF EMERGENCY HILL BE LIFTED SOON, MRS. GANDHI SAID SHE WOULD ANNOUNCE SOME MAJOR ECONOMIC REFORMS IN A FEW DAYS.

THE ONLY REPORTS OF VIOLENCE CAME FROM STATES OUTSIDE NEW DELHI AND WERE DNLY MINDR IN NATURE, JIM BENNETT (ABC) SAID, HOWEVER, GANDHI IS BRINGING IN ARMED FORCES OUTSIDE THE CAPITAL TO QUELL ANTICIPATED DISTURBANCES, BENNETT SAID, -- AP; UPI; NETWORKS (6/27/75)

FBT CHARGES TWO WITH SOVIET SPYING

FRI AGENTS IN NEW YORK AND BALTIMORE ARRESTED TWO MEN FRIDAY ON CHARGES OF SPYING IN THIS COUNTRY FOR THE SOVIET UNION, THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT SAID. THE MEN, DISTANT RELATIVES, ARE IDENTIFIED AS SARKIS PASKALIAN, A NEW YORK JEWELER, CHARGED WITH A POSSIBLE MAXIMUM DEATH PENALTY FOR CONSPIRACY TO GATHER CLASSIFIED NATIONAL DEFENSE INFORMATION TO AID A FOREIGN COUNTRY, AND SAHAG DEDEYAN, A ROCKVILLE, MO. MATHEMATICIAN, CHARGED WITH FAILURE TO REPORT THE ILLEGAL PHOTOGRAPHING OF NATIONAL DEFENSE INFORMATION. BOTH MEN ARE OF LEBANFSE EXTRACTION. DEDEYAN, WHO WAS LATER RELEASED ON BOND, IS A NATURALIZED CITIZEN AND PASKALIAN IS A RESIDENT ALTEN.

THE FBI SATO THAT THREE SOVIET INTELLIGENCE AGENTS WHO HELD DIPLOMATIC POSTS AT THE UNITED NATIONS WERE PASKALIAN'S CONTACTS. THE THREE MEN -- WHO LEFT THE U.S. "SOME TIME AGD," ABC SATO-WERE NAMED AS CO-CONSPIRATORS. PASKALIAN WAS IDENTIFIED AS A SOVIET SPY MORE THAN TEN YEARS AGO. DEDLYAN HAS AN ASSOCIATE MATHEMATICIAN AT THE JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY APPLIED PHYSICS LABORATORY AND LATER AT OPERATIONS RESEARCH, INC., BOTH IN SILVER SPRING, MARYLAND. BOTH ORGANIZATIONS DO RESEARCH FOR THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT.

THE FBT SAID PASKALIAN PHOTOGRAPHED ABOUT 70 PAGES OF A CLASSIFIED REPORT OF DEDEVAN'S AND PASSED IT ON TO SOVIET AGENTS. DEDEVAN AGREED NOT TO REPORT THE INCIDENT AND RECEIVED \$1,000 FROM PASKALIAN, ACCORDING TO THE FBI.

VICE PRESIDENT NELSON ROCKFFELLER DENIED FRIDAY HE HAD SAID FORMER PRESIDENT JOHN KENNEDY AND ATTY. GEN. ROBERT KENNEDY MAY HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN ASSASSINATION PLOTS DEVELOPED BY THE CIA. "YES, MA'AM," HE TOLD INTERVIEWER BARBARA WALTERS, ASKED ABOUT CRITICISM AGAINST HIM "FOR IMPLYING THAT PRESIDENT KENNEDY AND HIS BROTHER, ROBERT, MAY HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE ASSASSINATION PLOT," THE VICE PRESIDENT REPLIED: "THAT IS TOTALLY FALSE CRITICISM."

ROCKEFELLER NOTED THE MATTER HAD COME UP AS PART OF AN ANSWER TO A QUESTION ON WHY HIS COMMISSION ON THE CIA HAD NOT INCLUDED MATERIAL IN ITS REPORT ON THE ALLEGED ASSASSINATION PLOTS.

"I SAID THE REASON OF DIDN'T INCLUDE IT WAS BECAUSE WE COULD NOT DEVELOP ANY HARD EVIDENCE WHICH WOULD WARRANT A DECISION," ROCKEFELLER SAID.

BUT OF COURSE KISSINGER AND FORD WERE SPEAKING ABOUT TURKEY.
THEY WERE SPEAKING, AS STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS POINTED OUT,
ABOUT GREECE AND THAILAND.

U.S. BASES ABROAD ARE THERE FOR MUTUAL DEFENSE. THEY ALSO ENTAIL A DRAIN ON U.S. RESOURCES AND A BOON TO LOCAL ECONOMIES. IF SOME COUNTRIES THINK THEY CAN GO IT ALONE, THAT IS THEIR PREROGATIVE. 

IT MAY NEVER BE FORMALIZED AS THE "FORD DOCTRINE," BUT THE PRESIDENT'S PRESS CONFERENCE STATEMENT THAT THE U.S. WILL HELP OTHER NATIONS DEFEND THEIR FREEDOM WITH ARMS AND ECONOMIC AID, BUT NOT HITH AMERICAN TROOPS, IS A SIGNIFICANT SHIFT IN U.S. POLICY. THE BONN GOVERNMENT SHOULD THINK CAREFULLY BEFORE IT WHOLLY SPURNS ANOTHER AGREFMENT TO DEFSET THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS LOSSES THE U.S. INCURS BY KEEPING 200,000 TROOPS IN WEST GERMANY. IF THIS BECOMES A FIXED POLICY POSITION, RATHER THAN AN OPENER FOR NEGOTIATIONS, CONGRESS MIGHT REACT ADVERSELY EVEN IN THIS PERIOD OF POST-VIETNAM STIFFENING ON DEFENSE MATTERS.

THE JACKSON-NUNN AMENDMENT STIPULATED THAT AMERICAN TROOP STRENGTH IN EUROPE WOULD BE REDUCED IN PROPORTION TO ANY WEST EUROPEAN FAILURE TO OFFSET AMERICAN PAYMENTS PRODUCES COSTS OF ABOUT \$2 BILLION A YEAR. THIS YEAR CONGRESS WISELY ARSTAINED FROM THIS KIND OF INTHUSION IN COMPLEX DIPLOMACY, BUT ITS ATTITUDE COULD HARDEN IF THE GERMANS BECOME ADAMANT.

THE SITUATION REQUIRES DEFT HANDLING BECAUSE THE WASHINGTON-BONN CONNECTION IS THE MOST TMPORTANT PART OF THIS COUNTRY SMOST IMPORTANT ALLIANCE, NATO, SECRETARY KISSINGER WAS CORRECT IN WARNING CERTAIN ALLIES THEY WOULD UNDERNINE THEIR OWN SECURITY MORE THAN OURS BY CLOSING U.S. BASES.

WASHINGTON SHOULD BE FLEXIBLE ABOUT THE KIND OF FINANCIAL PACKAGE IT IS WILLING TO ACCEPT FROM WEST GERMANY. WHILE NATO RETAINS A USEFULNESS LOST BY SOME OTHER ALLIANCES, ITS CHARACTER IS BOUND TO CHANGE UNDER THE FORCE OF STRONG ECONOMIC AND DUMESTIC POLITICAL PRESSURES, THERE NEED BE NOTHING SACROSANCT ABOUT THE COMPOSITION OF OFFSET AGREEMENTS OR THE PRECISE LEVELS OF U.S. TROUP DEPLOYMENTS SO LONG AS THE U.S. AND WEST GERMANY RETAIN A SPIRIT OF MUTUAL CONFIDENCE AND MUTUAL RESPECT, A SENSE OF SHARED DANGER AND SHARED SECURITY. SECRETARY KISSINGER IS LABORING UNDER THREE HANDICAPS WHICH TO HIM ARE UNUSUAL AND UNNATURAL. FIRST, HE HAS LUST THAT UNIQUE "GOOD GUY" STATUS WHICH WAS HIS OURING THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION: SECOND, DR. KISSINGER IS STILL VERY MUCH LIVING IN THE WARE OF THE "COLLAPSE" (HIS WORD) OF THE AMERICAN POSITION IN INDOCHINA, THIRD, HIS CURRENT POLICIES ON TURKEY AND ISPAEL ARE BEING RESTRICTED BY POWERFUL ORGANIZATIONS WHICH HAVE MOUNTED MASSIVE PUBLICITY CAMBAIGNS.

THE FND RESULT OF THESE THREE NEW FACTORS IN AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY MAKING IS KISSINGER CAN NO LONGER APPORD HIS ACCUSTOMED LUXURY OF SPENDING MOST OF MIS TIME ROAMING THE WORLD WHILE AN ADMIRING, ALMOST ADDRING, CONGRESS PROMPTLY VOTES HIM ANYTHING HE WANTS, IT MEANS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN HIS PUBLIC CAREER HE IS STUMPING THE COUNTRY IN A SERIES OF APPEARANCES AIMED AT BOLSTERING HIS POLITICAL POSITION ON CAPITOL HILL.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTABLE RESULTS? WITH RESPECT TO TURKEY, THE ESSENTIAL FACT IS THE TURKS HAVE BEEN AS CONSIDERATE AS POSSIBLE FOR KISSINGER AND, WHILE THREATENING TO CLOSE AMERICAN AIR BASES. HAVE IN FACT GIVEN KISSINGER ALL THE TIME THEY DARE TO MAKE HIS ARRANGEMENTS IN THE CONGRESS. THE APPEARANCE OF A CONFRONTATION BETHEEN ANKARA AND WASHINGTON IS MORE VISIBLE THAN REAL. WITH RESPECT TO ISRAEL, KISSINGER IS GETTING SOME RESULTS. THE ISRAELI SOFTENING IS LESS THAN KISSINGER WANTS AND NEEDS, BUT AT LEAST, THERE IS SOME SOFTENING - PERHAPS JUST BARELY ENOUGH TO PERMIT KISSINGER TO GO BACK IN THE PHYPTIANS TH ANOTHER ROUND OF PEACEMAKING.
