JERUSALEM, AUG. 17, REUTER - THE ISRAELI CABINET TODAY APPROVED THE POSITION ADOPTED BY ITS NEGOTIATING TEAM ON A NEW INTERIM AGREEMENT WITH EGYPT, BUT MADE NO MENTION OF A POSSIBLE VISIT TO THE AREA THIS WEEK BY SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER.

A COMMUNIQUE SAID THE CABINET APPROVED IMPORTANT ISSUES ON WHICH AGREEMENT HAD NOT YET BEEN REACHED WITH EGYPT.

""AT ITS SESSION TODAY THE CABINET GAVE ITS APPROVAL TO THE POSITION OF THE MINISTERIAL TEAM ON THE ISSUES OF AN INTERIM SETTLEMENT, AS IT HAS BEEN CLARIFIED TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING ISSUES OF IMPORTANCE ON WHICH AGREEMENT HAS NOT YET BEEN REACHED,"" THE STATEMENT SAID.

""THE CABINET AUTHORIZED THE MINISTERIAL TEAM (OF PREMIER YITZHAK RABIN, FOREIGN MINISTER YIGAL ALLON AND DEFENSE MINISTER SHIMON PERES) TO CONTINUE THE NEGOTIATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POSITIONS APPROVED BY THE CABINET.""

OBSERVERS SAID THE CONTINUED NEGOTIATIONS COULD BE CARRIED OUT DIRECTLY WITH DR. KISSINGER IF HE DECIDES THE CLARIFICATIONS FROM HERE WARRANT A RENEWED ROUND OF SHUTTLE DIPLOMACY.

THE CABINET HAD BEEN EXPECTED TO INVITE DR. KISSINGER TO RENEW HIS PERSONAL DIPLOMACY LATER THIS WEEK.

TODAY"S REGULAR WEEKLY CABINET SESSION WAS DELAYED FOR AN HOUR TO ENABLE THE NEGOTIATING TEAM TO HOLD FURTHER CONSULTATIONS.

PRIME MINISTER RABIN AND HIS NEGOTIATING COLLEAGUES
CONFERRED WITH JUSTICE MINISTER HAIM ZADOK AND CHIEF OF STAFF
LIEUTENANT GENERAL MORDECHAI GUR ON LEGAL AND MILITARY
QUESTIONS INVOLVED IN THE PROPOSED SETTLEMENT--AND RESERVATIONS
BY SOME FACTIONS OF THE CABINET.

THE CHIEF REMAINING OBSTACLES TO AN AGREEMENT WERE UNDERSTOOD TO INCLUDE ISRAEL'S INSISTENCE THAT VACATED AREAS BE DEMILITARIZED AND PUT UNDER UNITED NATIONS CONTROL, AND DIFFERENCES OVER THE NUMBER AND ROLE OF AMERICAN TECHNICIANS WHO WILL TAKE OVER ISRAELI ELECTRONIC EARLY WARNING POSTS IN THE SINAL.

ISRAEL ALSO IS SEEKING AID FROM THE U.S. IN REPLACING SUPPLIES LOST BY PULLING BACK FROM THE ABU RUDEIS OIL FIELDS IN SINAI, AND IN BUILDING A NEW DEFENSE LINE THERE. THIS IS IN ADDITION TO AN EARLIER REQUEST FOR MORE THAN TWO BILLION DOLLARS WORTH OF AID.
