Ladies and Gentlemen:

I have come to Paris to meet with President Giscard and the Foreign Minister to report to them about my discussions with Prime Minister Vorster and our initiatives in Africa. The future of southern Africa has great dangers but also many opportunities for a peaceful evolution. And of course, the relationship of Africa to other countries is of the profoundest concern to Europe and especially to France which has such a long historical relationship with that continent.

So I look forward to my talks tomorrow with the President which will review this and other subjects of mutual interest with an ally that we value and a leader whom we trust.
