HAVING READ THE COMPLETE RECORD OF THE CONVERSATION BETWEEN DR. KISSINGER AND AMBASSADOR HUANG HUA ON APRIL 16, THE CHINESE SIDE IS AWARE THAT THE U.S. SIDE HAS NO INTEREST WHATSOEVER IN HAVING AMERICAN NEWSMEN TO COME TO PEKING TO REPORT ON THE OPENING OF THE U.S. LIAISON OFFICE AND AMBASSADOR BRUCE'S ARRIVAL AND THAT THE U.S. SIDE CONSIDERS IT NOT THE BEST TIME TO DO IT. IN FACT THE CHINESE SIDE HAD TAKEN AN INDIFFERENT ATTITUDE TOWARDS THIS MATTER. HAVING RECONSIDERED THE MATTER, THE CHINESE SIDE HAS NOW DECIDED NOT TO ACCEPT THE APPLICATION OF AMERICAN CORRESPONDENTS FOR A VISIT TO CHINA FOR THAT PURPOSE. HOWEVER, THE CHINESE SIDE WISHES TO INFORM THE U.S. SIDE THAT AS KEYS BEECH, A FOREIGN AFFAIRS CORRESPONDENT OF THE "CHICAGO DAILY NEWS", HAD ASKED TO VISIT CHINA FOR AN INTERVIEW WITH PRINCE SIHANOUK, THE CHINESE SIDE WILL STILL ALLOW HIM TO COME TO INTERVIEW THE PRINCE.
