1. I am aware that Ambassador Bruce is not available, but I seek the consolidated judgment of Jenkins and Holdridge on the timing of my upcoming visit.

- 2. In the event that the Chinese response to my queries on what of my visit outcome/we might expect with regard to Cambodia is unsatisfactory, I am thinking seriously that it might be wise to delay my trip until after the bombing halt on August 15, perhaps to early September.

 If I should visit Peking before the bombing halt, my visit will inevitably be seen in the context of a Cambodian settlement. Under these circumstances, a failure to come back with a solution on Cambodia could have a negative impact in the U.S., not only with respect to the Cambodian issue, but also with respect to our entire policy of rapprochement with the PRC.
- 3. We will not, in any case, make a decision until we have heard from the Chinese, but I solicit your views on the timing of my visit in the event we are not reassured by their comments regarding Cambodia.
