SUBJECT: SOVIET DELIVERY OF ARMS TO EGYPT DURING OCTOBER 1973.
REF: CAIRO 1773, PARA 3 AND CAIRO 2030.

1. AS I PREVIOUSLY REPORTED, QUESTION AROSE DURING RECENT HOUSE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE VISIT OF THE EXTENT TO WHICH EGYPT HAS RECEIVED REPLACEMENTS FOR WEAPONS AND EQUIPMENT LOST IN THE OCTOBER, 1973 WAR, DURING AND IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONFLICT. SADAT, BOTH PRIVATELY AND PUBLICLY, HAS CONTENDED THE SOVIETS DID NOT REPLACE EGYPTIAN LOSSES. HE HAS PILLORIED THEM PUBLICLY FOR FAILING TO DO SO. EGYPTIANS CLAIM THAT SUCH OBLIGATION EXISTED, ACCORDING TO FAHMY, CLAIM IS BASED ON ONE INTERPRETATION OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN EGYPT AND USSR OF MAY 27, 1971.

2. SADAT ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THERE WAS AN ACCELERATED DELIVERY OF SOVIET MILITARY EQUIPMENT IN THE PERIOD OF OCTOBER, 1973 TO APRIL, 1974, BUT MAINTAINS THIS REPRESENTS MILITARY EQUIPMENT FOR WHICH CONTRACTS HAD BEEN SIGNED WITH SOVIETS IN 1972 AND IN MARCH, 1973, RATHER THAN REPLACEMENT OF LOST WEAPONS. SIMILARLY, SADAT CONTENDS THAT RECENTLY RESUMED SOVIET ARMS SHIPMENTS FALL INTO THE CATEGORY OF FULFILLMENT OF THESE EARLIER CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS.

EM HOUSE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE, WHEN HERE, HEARD MUCH OF THE DETAILS FROM SADAT. THE PRESIDENT CLAIMED THAT ONLY ONE-TENTH OF HIS LOSSES HAD BEEN REPLACED. (CONTEXT IN WHICH HE MADE THIS RE- MARK SUGGESTS HE WAS TALKING ABOUT AIRCRAFT.) CODEL REMAINED CONFUSED ABOUT FACTS, ESPECIALLY SINCE DIA REPRESENTATIVE GOT UP DURING EMBASSY BRIEFING SESSION AND STATED HIS ORGANIZATION'S ASSESSMENT THAT VIRTUALLY ALL EGYPTIAN LOSSES REPLACED. THIS IS ALSO WHAT ISRAELIS TOLD CODEL. AS A RESULT, CHAIRMAN PRICE, PRIOR TO LEAVING, ASKED THAT I SPECIFICALLY PUT THE QUESTION TO THE PRESIDENT ON HOW HIS STATEMENT ON ARMS CAN BE RECONCILED WITH ISRAELI CLAIMS, SUPPORTED BY DIA, THAT ALL EGYPTIAN ARMS LOST IN OCTOBER, 1973, WERE REPLACED DURING AND IMMEDIATELY AFTERWARDS. I DID SO THROUGH MARWAN, WHO PUT THE QUESTION TO THE PRESIDENT. A FEW DAYS AGO, MARWAN, AT THE PRESIDENT'S EXPRESS DIRECTION, SENT ME A LONG TOP SECRET LIST OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT RECEIVED FROM THE SOVIET UNION BY AIR AND BY SEA IN OCTOBER, 1973. THIS INCLUDES DATES, AMOUNTS, TYPES AND TONNAGES. NO DATA WAS PROVIDED FOR NOVEMBER, 1973 THROUGH APRIL, 1974.

4. IN VIEW HIGH CLASSIFICATION, I ASKED MARWAN TODAY FOR CLARIFI- CATION AS TO WHETHER PRESIDENT REALLY WISHED THIS LIST TO BE GIVEN TO THE COMMITTEE. MARWAN EXPLAINED THAT PRESIDENT WANTED YOU TO HAVE IT TO REFUTE ISRAELI AND DIA CLAIMS. HE SUGGESTED YOU MIGH WISH TO PASS A COPY TO SECRETARY SCHLESINGER ON A STRICTLY CONFI- DENTIAL BASIS FOR HIS INFORMATION. MARWAN AFFIRMED THAT THE PRESIDENT DOES NOT WANT THE ENTIRE LIST TO GO TO THE COMMITTEE. HOWEVER, MARWAN HAS NO OBJECTION IF WE PASS THE COMMITTEE NUMBERS OF FLIGHTS, SHIPS AND TONNAGES.

5. QUOTED BELOW IS A TRANSLATION OF MARWAN'S LIST. WE WILL BY SEPTTEL SEND A LOWER CLASSIFICATION MESSAGE WITH INFOR- MATION OF FLIGHTS AND TONNAGES FOR USE WITH THE COMMITTEE.
