Colonel Carlson:

We have a report that Binh Tram 18 is

having some success in moving supplies.

Dr. Kissinger:

I wish there were a way to do something about it, what are we doing about it? Waiting for the dry season? Precisely what are we doing about the logistics buildup? What are we doing with gunships? Are they hitting along the trail?

Colonel Carlson:

We have been hitting supplies in Route Package 1.

Kissinger:

But you just give me gross figures. I can't make any sense out of that. For all I know you may be hitting water buffalo in a rice field. I would like to know what somebody thinks we are doing. We are taking the heat. Where do we think we are going? How are we going to get more airplanes for another year? I want to know what the interdiction package is. Are we hitting

in the Mugia pass area?

Colonel Carlson: Yes we are hitting over in the pass areas where

some of the roads have gone out.

Dr. Kissinger: What are the F-4s doing?

Colonel Carlson: They are working on the roads and logistics

buildups. They hit the roads in the day time

and continue to hit them at night.

Dr. Kissinger: Anyone must know that they are not going to move

their supplies during the day time so we have

to develop better procedures. Are we hitting supply

dumps?

Colonel Carlson: Yes we have hit supply dumps.

Dr. Kissinger: Well I would like a plan for what we plan to do to

counteract the enemy logistics buildup, and I would

like to know what we are doing with the gunships.

Colonel Carlson: I will report this sir.
