The Iraqi Embassy in Damascus reported yesterday that the situation in the Golan Heights was tense adn that the Syrians had been forced to withdraw and reorganize. In the Sinal, several artillery exchanges have been reported since dawn. There are no indications yet, however, that either the Egyptians or the Israelis intend on launching a major offensive today, Israeli tank troops told visiting newsmen that their present aim in the south was to contain the huge Egyptian force concentrated there until the offensive has been pushed through against Syria.
