HEROIN SEIZURE IN MEXICO: LAST WEEK IN A JOINT DEA/MEX-  
ICAN POLICE OPERATION, 33 KILOGRAMS OF HEROIN WERE SEIZED  
IN TIJUANA. THIS IS THE LARGEST HEROIN SEIZURE IN MEXICO TO  
DATE. (LOW)

INTER-AMERICAN BODIES ESTABLISHED: THE SIXTEENTH SESSION OF  
ECLA (THE UN ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR LATIN AMERICA) CON-  
CLUDED ITS SESSION IN TRINIDAD LAST WEEK WITH A DECISION TO  
CREATE A SUBSIDIARY BODY, THE CARIBBEAN DEVELOPMENT AND CO-  
OPERATION COMMITTEE. THIS WAS A HIGHLY CONTENTIOUS ISSUE AT  
THE BESSION BECAUSE THE U.S. AND OTHER DEVELOPED COUNTRIES  
WOULD BE DENIED MEMBERSHIP IN THE SUBSIDIARY BODY. THE U.S.  
OPPOSED SETTING SUCH A PRECEDENT WHILE CUBA, TRINIDAD, AND  
SEVERAL OTHERS STRONGLY SUPPORTED CREATION OF THE BODY. (LOW)

FORMER JAPANESE PRIME MINISTER ETSAKU SATO SUFFERED A STROKE MONDAY.

SATO, WHO IS 74 YEARS OLD, HAD THE LONGEST POST-WAR TENURE OF ANY JAPANESE PRIME MINISTER, HOLDING THE OFFICE FROM 1965 TO 1972. DURING THE STRAINED PERIOD OF U.S.-JAPAN RELATIONS IN 1971, SATO HELD UP THE JAPANESE END EXCEEDINGLY WELL IN THE FACE OF SEVERE PRESSURE ON THE ALLIANCE IN JAPAN FOLLOWING THE SEVERAL "NIXON SHOCKS." SATO WON THE NOBEL PEACE PRIZE LAST YEAR FOR HIS EFFORTS TO KEEP JAPAN FROM EXERCISING ITS NUCLEAR OPTION. ACTING SECRETARY INGER-SOLL IS SENDING A MESSAGE EXPRESSING HOPE FOR SATO'S EARLY RECOVERY.

U.S.-USSR RECIPROCAL NAVAL VISITS: THE EXCHANGE VISITS OF U.S. AND USSR NAVAL SHIPS RESPECTIVELY TO LENINGRAD AND BOSTON CONCLUDED ON MAY 17 WITHOUT INCIDENT AND WITH MUCH FAVORABLE PUBLICITY AND EFFECT. BOTH THE SOVIET AND U.S. CREWS WERE TREATED TO AN EXTENSIVE ROUND OF SIGHT-SEEING, RECEPTIONS AND LOCAL HOSPITALITY. IN BOSTON, 35,000 PEOPLE VISITED THE SOVIET SHIPS. THE OFFICIAL HIGHLIGHT OF THE SOVIET SHIPS' STAY IN BOSTON WAS A VISIT TO THE SOVIET FLAGSHIP BY ADMIRAL HOLLOWAY, WHILE A HIGH POINT FOR THE SOVIET CREWS PROBABLY WAS THE STANDING OVATION THEY RECEIVED WHEN INTRODUCED AT A BOSTON RED SOX GAME.
