SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ITEMS

AMBASSADOR MOYNIHAN ON YUGOSLAV HOSTILITY AT UNI ANHAS—SADOR MUYNIHAN HAS REPORTED THAT A SERIES OF ACTIONS DURING THE OPENING DAYS OF THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY SESSION INDICATE THAT THE YUGOSLAVS ARE STILL GOING OUT OF THEIR WAY TO INTERVENE IN A MOSTILE AND OFFENSIVE MANNER AGAINST THE U.S. ON ITEMS OF PARTICULAR IMPORTANCE TO US. SEVERAL OF THESE ACTIONS HAVE INVOLVED THEIR TAKING THE FLOOR TO USE VIETNAM TO ATTACK THE U.S., OFTEN DURING DEBATES COMPLETELY UNRELATED TO SOUTHEAST ASIA. THE YUGOSLAVS HAVE BEEN IN THE FOREFRONT OF THE MOVE TO ADMIT BOTH VIETNAMS TO THE UN AND HAVE BEEN ACTIVE IN ORGANIZING OPPOSITION TO THE U.S. POSITION.

AMBASSADOR MOYNIMAN STATES THAT THESE INCIDENTS ARE MERELY
THE LATEST IN A THREE-YEAR SERIES OF YUGOSLAV EFFORTS DIRECTED
AGAINST THE U.S. IN THE UN FORUM ON ISSUES SUCH AS PUERTO
PICO IN THE COMMITTEE OF 24, THE PANAMA CANAL AND GUANTANAMO,
KOREA, AND VIETNAM -+ ALL ISSUES OF IMMEDIATE AND MAJOR
IMPORTANCE TO THE U.S. AND, AT THE SAME TIME, FAR DISTANT
FROM YUGOSLAVIA, THE AMBASSADOR ASSERTS THAT THE U.S.—
YUGOSLAV RELATIONSHIP MOULD BE SOUNDER IF WE MADE IT CLEAR APE
TO THE YUGOSLAVS THAT HE ARE NOT PREPARED TO ACCEPT GRAT—
UITOUSLY OFFENSIVE BEMAVIOR AGAINST IMPORTANT U.S. INTERESTS

AND POSITIONS, PARTICULARLY WHEN THEY INVOLVE SUBJECTS AND

GEOGRAPHY FAR FROM YUGOSLAVIA. HE ADDS THAT "NO COUNTRY" AT THE UN -- NOT EVEN ALBANIA -- IS MORE CONSISTENTLY ACTIVE OR POISONOUS AGAINST MAJOR U.S. POSITIONS, AND THAT THE YUGOSLAVS OF THE U.S. CONSIDERABLE HARM AT THE UN AND DO IT GLEEFULLY. THE AMBASSADOR CONCLUDES THAT HE DOES NOT WISH TO LET THIS MATTER STAND IN TERMS OF WHAT HE CAN OR CANNOT DO TO OR FOR YUGOSLAVIA. THE QUESTION IS WHAT THEY ARE DOING TO US. HE EMPHASIZES THAT THEY ARE DOING EVERY—THING POSSIBLE TO DECLARE TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON EVERY POSSIBLE OCCASION THAT THE U.S. SUFFERED A HUMILIATING MILITARY AND POLITICAL DEFFAT IN VIETNAM AND THAT, IN CONSEQUENCE, WE ARE A DIMINISMED AND HUMILIATED POWER. HE POINTS OUT THAT THIS IS A VIEW TWO THIRDS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS WILLING AND EVEN EAGER TO BELIFVE, BUT HE URGES THAT WE NOT ENCOURAGE IT. (GATES)

PEKING GIVES AMMESTY TO 144 "U.S. - CHIANG ARMED ABENTS" -: AS A FOLLOW-ON TO THEIR AMNESTY EARLIER THIS YEAR OF ALL NATIONALIST CHINESE "WAR CRIMINALS" OF THE CIVIL WAR PERIOD, PEKING ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY THE RELEASE OF 144 "U.S. -CHIANG" ARMED SPECIAL AGENTS APPREHENDED WHILE ATTEMPTING TO IN-FILTRATE PRC-CONTROLLED TERRITORY BY BOAT. THE NONA PRESS RELEASE SAID THAT THE AMNESTIED MEN WOULD BE GIVEN THE RIGHTS OF CITIZENSHIP AND JOBS, WHILE THOSE WHO WISHED TO PETURN TO TAIWAN WOULD BE PERMITTED TO LEAVE PRO TERRITORY AND WOULD BE GIVEN TRAVEL MONEY FOR THE RETURN JOURNEY. PEKING APPEARS TO HAVE TWO MOTTVES IN THIS REPEAT PERFORMANCE OF THE TWAR CRIMINALM RELEASE. THEY SERIOUSLY EMBARRASSED THE TATPET GOVERNMENT IN SENDING THE PREVIOUS GROUP OF AMNESTIED MEN TO HONG KONG, WHERE THEY TRIED WITHOUT SUC-CESS TO GAIN VISAS FOR TAIWAN. THUS, PEKING APPEARS TO WANT AGAIN TO CREATE THE IMPRESSION OF A CONCILIATORY ATTITUDE ON THE PART OF THE PRO. WHICH CAN BE CONTRASTED WITH AN ANTICIPATED UNRESPONSIVENESS AND OBDURACY ON THE PART OF TAIPET PEKING MAY ALSO BE TRYING TO BUILD A CASE -- FOR POSSIBLE USE DURING YOUR FORTHCOMING TRIP -- THAT WHILE THE PRO WANTS A PEACEFUL RESOLUTION OF THE TAIWAN QUESTION, THE AUTHORITIES IN TAIPET HAVE REPEATEDLY SPURNED GESTURES OF CONCILIATION. WHAT EXACT USE PEKING MIGHT ATTEMPT TO MAKE OF THIS LATTER ARGUMENT REMAINS TO BE SEEN. (SOLOMON)
