1. Reference is made to your memorandum dated 22 January 1953 requesting a Covert Security Clearance for Subject's use as a translator and agent instructor under Project AERODYNAMIC in the U.S.

2. In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Director's Memorandum of 14 February 1949, entitled "Security and Operational Clearances", a Covert Security Clearance is granted for the covert use of the Subject as described in your request set forth in paragraph 1 above. However, certain covert inquiries are still outstanding in regard to the Subject, and the above requested clearance is being granted contingent on the favorable completion of these inquiries. In the event any information is developed which would affect this clearance, you will be immediately notified.

3. The Subject is not to represent himself as, nor is he to be represented as, an employee of CIA.

4. Your attention is called to the fact that a Covert Security Clearance does not constitute complete compliance with the provisions of CIA Regulation 10-3. Therefore, if you should desire at a later date to change the status or use of this individual, a request for clearance to cover any proposed change should be submitted to this office.

5. This clearance becomes invalid in the event the Subject's services are not utilized within 90 days of the date of this memorandum.
